This Sunday, March 5th, five of our Catechumen (those preparing for full initiation into the Catholic Church) Laura Rosenberg-Ball, Charles Karen, Teneisha Thomas, Michael Colon and Isabella El Amrani and all catechumen from the Diocese will gather at St. Patrick's Cathedral together with their godparents to celebrate the Rite of Election. These Catechumen will be chosen, accepted, and elected by Cardinal Timothy Dolan to complete their initiation into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. They will sign their names into the Book of the Elect. After this ritual, they are no longer known as catechumen, but "the Elect." We extend our congratulations to all of them for their dedication and hard work on their journey to become Catholic.

### <u>Pastor's Letter</u>

#### Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to the First Sunday of Lent. We are challenged once again by the themes that are found in the readings of Sacred Scripture of Genesis, Paul's Letter to the Romans and Saint Matthew's account of the Temptation of Jesus in the desert.

In the Book of Genesis, we find ourselves with Adam and Eve in the Garden of Paradise. For one, brief, shining moment, we had it all. Paradise, the right relationship and friendship with God. There we found plenty of food, beautiful creation and there was no shame. Then along comes the devil and he is a liar, a tempter and a con artist. People have debated this question for years, was it the apple that got Eve, then Adam in trouble? No, it wasn't the apple, but the pair beneath the tree (it's an old joke!). The question raised up and down the history of the human race comes from God. Why are you hiding? What are you hiding from? The introduction of fig leaves and covering our shame prompts God to deduce, Adam & Eve are guilty of disobedience. So after the Fall of Adam and Eve, comes the question: How do we get back into paradise? How do I overcome shame and return in to a right relationship with God and one another?

The Holy Season of Lent is a call from the Lord: Come, let us return to the Lord, He will heal us, He will bind up our wounds. Why is this season important? Because through prayer, fasting and almsgiving we discover our own self-deceit and we are invited to repent of our sins. Jesus will bring us back into Paradise by becoming our Savior, our suffering servant, our final means to get reconciled with God and each other. Mary, the Mother of God is the New Eve and Jesus is the New Adam leading us back into Paradise. We need to be in prayer to ponder this mystery of our faith.

In the Letter to the Romans, we are reminded that sin and death came into the world through the disobedience of one man, but it would be reversed through the obedience of one man, Jesus. Jesus paid the price for all our sins. This was precisely His mission; he came and still comes to set us free.

In today's Gospel, we are reminded that even Jesus, at His Baptism, was reminded by the Father's voice and the presence of the Holy Spirit; that he is indeed, Son, Chosen and Beloved. At the beginning of his public ministry, Jesus goes into the desert for 40 days and 40 nights. Lent is 40 days, and in the desert all the false self is stripped away. Yet once again, as in the Garden of Paradise, the devil comes to tempt Jesus. Jesus was tempted to satisfy his hunger, but no, we do not live on bread alone but every word that comes from the mouth of God. Jesus was tempted with wealth, fortune and power. So are we, all the time, "Save yourselves," is also a temptation. I don't need God, I'm self- sufficient. But Jesus says no, He will enter public life, a Messiah who is a suffering servant to the loving will of the Father, and not the devil's taunts. Jesus is tempted to false worship, but he responds, No! He will only worship the Father in Spirit and truth. So what is the false idol that overtakes our life? Is it wealth, hoarding riches, not sharing with the needy and poor? Is it looking out only for ourselves and not forgiving others? Is it pride, on our reputation or position in authority and looking down on others? The Temptation of the Devil is alive and well and we can become easily duped. However, when we fast from wine, beer, meat on Fridays, chocolate, sumptuous six course meals, we empty ourselves of our self and hunger for the only satisfying one who lead us back into Paradise. We don't have to wait for rigor mortis to set in to gain Paradise. We can draw closer to Christ, especially in Confession, Mass, Stations of the Cross or an hour of Eucharistic Adoration from 9PM to 9AM on a Friday night into early Saturday morning. Let us draw near to Christ, who hungers, fasts, resists temptation and in an act of unspeakable love and obedience died on the Cross and rose again, to set us free. May this Lent be a springtime to help you become re-rooted in Christ's love and mercy!

On Monday March 6 in O'Mara Hall at 7PM, the National Guard will be offering a presentation on Preparation for Weather Disasters. Insights that have been gained from Hurricane Sandy will be shared. All are welcome.

Father Basil on Monday Evening, March 13 at 7PM will be offering Mass with many of his Nigerian brother priests to pray for his home town of Kafanchan, and the surrounding villages of the state of Kaduna in Northern Nigeria. The Fulani herdsmen are a group of nomads who have been looting and setting fire to homes and killing people in large numbers. At this point, many of the Nigerian priests' families and friends have been spared but all have been threatened and need God's protection. So please join us.

After that Mass at 8PM there will a "Show and Tell" in the D'Amato Room in the Athletic Center for the people who traveled this past year to the Missionaries of the Poor in Kingston, Jamaica. All are invited. We will welcome Greg Lemieux, a FOCUS missionary at Benedictine College in Atchison, Kansas. FOCUS stands for Fellowship of Catholic University Students. Greg joined us for two years on our mission trip to Kingston, Jamaica. He will have just returned from a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. It will be a spirited gathering.

The Nocturnal Adoration committee of Our Lady Star of the Sea has requested that during the Fridays of Lent following the Stations of the Cross, that there be Eucharistic Adoration in the small chapel from 9PM to 9AM. This sacrifice is powerful especially during the Holy Season of Lent.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults will be present during each of the 10:30 Masses of the Lenten Season for rites of ongoing conversion, and following the homily, will be presented to the congregation. Let us pray for these wonderful people who are preparing for full reception into the Catholic Church during the Easter Season.
