### Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

We are in the home stretch before the great season of Lent. Lent begins on Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup> with Ash Wednesday and we will travel the road with Christ all the way to Easter Sunday, which for us this year is April 16. The Old English word for Lent meant "spring time". We are like the professional baseball players, who come out of their wintertime and enter into spring training. What are we training for? We are training to become intensified in our Catholic Faith, to embrace the reality of the Cross in our lives, repent of our sins, put our faith in love into action in our behavior and through our acts of charity. The three classic characteristics of Catholics during Lent is prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

People give up chocolate, wine, beer, broccoli, scotch, and steak and call that fasting. As a reminder, for people between the ages of 16-59, fasting is most appropriate during Fridays in Lent. During the Fridays of Lent we are asked not to eat meat. This is not so that we all just run to Red Lobster and gorge ourselves on expensive fish, but instead that we fast from rich foods and take the money that we would have spent and use that money to give alms (donations) to the Cardinal's Appeal, charities and or people in financial distress. Rather than getting into a major resolution over what to give up for Lent, why not ask the question, "What am I giving over to Christ for Lent?" Ideally, we are to deepen our spirituality. One form of fasting that recently makes sense is giving up "Facebook", or all the time we spend on social media. Perhaps we can attend a Bible Study, or pay a visit to Alba House – Saint Paul's Center and buy a good book on spirituality. Here are some recommendations:

Unbound, by Neal Lozano Sacred Fire, by Ronald Rolheiser, OMI Miracles Do Happen, by Sister Briege McKenna, OSC

Online, you can have access to great Catholic teaching, movies, classes and books by logging into FORMED.ORG. The parish password is 9F33RR.

There are groups of parishioners that are meeting to learn more about sacred scripture. The Renew International Program did a commentary on the Gospel of Saint Luke. People are gathering in the rectory basement on Thursday Mornings from 10AM to 11:30AM and a second group gathers from 7:30PM to 9PM. There is also a group of parishioners meeting to speak about topics relating to faith called "The Sons and Daughters of Mary," they gather at 10AM on Friday in the basement of the rectory. Also on Sunday Mornings from 7AM to 8:30AM, there is a Men's Prayer Group that meets to pray the Morning Prayer of the Church, Lauds, and to break open the Word of God, which is that Sunday's Scriptures. Therefore, if any of these groups fit into your timetable it is a wonderful chance for small Christian community to form, strengthen, and inspire one another.

One of the most important features of Lent is repentance and going to confession. We will make every effort all throughout Ash Wednesday and the Saturdays of Lent to have priests available in Church to hear confessions. Last year, it was a unique privilege to welcome hundreds of people on Ash Wednesday. On that day in a very public way, we all identify by being sinners, as we accept the mark of ashes on our foreheads. "Remember, O Man, that you are dust and unto dust you shall return" or "Repent and believe in the Holy Gospel". "Turn from sin and believe in the good news." This is the prayer that is said when we are receiving ashes.

It has always struck me that we should target this day, more than ever, since people come to accept the call to conversion. Whenever the sacrament of confession was available, the people who were "Surprised by mercy" have edified me. So come then and during Lent as well.

A most important event will occur on the week before Holy Week, April 3, 4, & 5, when we will host the Cluster Parish Mission. The Parishes of St. John Neumann, St. Joseph & St. Thomas and Our Lady Help of Christians are invited for a three evening parish mission conducted by Fr. Vincent Hoagland, CP (a Passionist Father), myself, Fr. Tom Devery and a witness from a local married couple. There will be a chance for confessions and there will be the celebration of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The graces of this mission will be enormous. So please mark your calendar and do not miss out. The mission will take place from 7:30 to 9pm in our church.

In addition, every Friday evening during the season of Lent there will be Stations of the Cross at 8 PM in the church. We will have the chance to make the journey with Jesus through the way of the Cross, participate in his passion and death, and await the resurrection.

As the Sundays of Lent unfold, we will also be praying and supporting our catechumens and candidates for Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation who will be received into the Church on the Vigil of Easter, Holy Saturday evening, April 15th. There are over 25 people who in preparation. Some will be received on Easter, and some on Pentecost. As you can see, there are many opportunities to draw closer to Christ this Lent.
