



A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

During this Easter Season of 50 days preparing for Pentecost, we rejoice and celebrate the life of the Risen Lord living within us. Next week Father Jude Siciliano, OP and Sister Pat Bruno, OP will be arriving to give us our Jubilee Parish Mission and in preparation for that I discovered an article that was written about the Holy Spirit as "Our Friend", written by Father John Sweeny from Pittsburgh.

"We moved through the season of Lent in preparation for our yearly liturgical celebration of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus. We are celebrating this particular season the year of Mercy called forth by Pope Francis. I would suggest that the war all might turn again to the God the Holy Spirit and ask the Spirit to come and 'fan into flame of our faith' once again. The only way we can 'stir up our faith' is by the power of the Holy Spirit. We cannot do this by our own ability. And the Holy Spirit is the Friend who is with us and within us (John 14:17) to give us faith and to deepen our faith."

Even though we do not see Him, the Holy Spirit is real – more real than the things we can see. There are many physical things in this world and in our lives which are invisible though real. A good example is oxygen in the air we breathe. We cannot see it, but it is there, surrounding us. If suddenly, there was no air, we would know it right away. And pretty soon, some other things that we cannot see without the assistance of medical equipment –like our hearts and brains – would sense there is no oxygen. We would die without this "invisible" substance.

The Holy Spirit is someone we cannot see but is real. It is interesting to note that one of the most common ways used to describe the Holy Spirit in the Bible is that He is like the air – "the breath of life" or "a powerful wind". We need this "Breath of Life". We need the Holy Spirit to continue to show us who Jesus is. We can never know Jesus unless the Holy Spirit reveals Him to us, just as He did at the Jordan River when Jesus was baptized. In this Year of Mercy, there is no better way for us to come to love Jesus more, to deepen or relationship with Him than to ask the Holy Spirit to deepen our knowledge of Jesus and to increase our love for Him. Jesus said the Holy Spirit would remind us of all that Jesus did and taught. (John14:26). This is exactly what the Holy Spirit continues to do every day. He will remind us of what Jesus did and taught when He was on the earth. Especially when we read or hear the Scriptures proclaimed, the Holy Spirit will make those Scriptures come alive so we can understand and see the Lord.

As we go through this Easter season, the Holy Spirit will help us to pray as He helped Jesus pray when He would "go off to a deserted place" to pray to His Father. The Holy Spirit was there with Him and filling Him as He communed with His Father.

Jesus exhaled (again like air) the Holy Spirit on us as He took His last dying breath on the cross. And the "driving wind" of the Holy Spirit then came to rest on the Apostles on that Pentecost morning, just as He has come, as a dove, to rest on Jesus at the Jordan River. And then, what happened to the Apostles? They began to see and understand the things that Jesus had said and did. They had been with Him for three years, listening to all He taught and seeing His miracles. They witnessed His Death and Resurrection. Jesus Himself had said to them on any number of occasions: Do you still not realize or understand.... Are your minds closed?" (Mark 8:17,21.) However, when they allowed the Holy Spirit to come to them, through Mary's presence and intercession (Acts 1:14) and enlighten their minds, they began to understand all that they had gone through with Jesus. Perhaps this one of the reasons Jesus told them that "it is better for you that I go..." (John 16:7) Then the Holy Spirit would come.

Many of us have been with Jesus for a time – some of us for a long time. There is still much we do not understand. We could know so much more of Jesus. We could come so much closer to Him, as we allow Him to come closer to us. This is now a time to allow the Holy Spirit to lead us into prayer: to pray more and to pray more deeply. As we come to Him, we will Him more clearly."

May the Holy Spirit lead us through this Parish Mission into more of the Easter graces God want us to experience.

A blessed Easter Season be upon you.
