St. Lydwina, Virgin – April 14

Lydwina was born in 1380 in Holland and became an invalid for the remainder of her life. She accepted the pain in reparation for the sins of others. She often meditated on Christ's passion and had great devotion to the Eucharist. Around 1407, she began to experience ecstasies and visions participating in the Christ's Passion. She saw Purgatory and Heaven and visited with the Saints. During the last 17 years of her life, her only food was the Holy Communion and for the last 7 years, she was almost completely blind. Her cult was formally confirmed by Pope Leo XIII in 1890. (JM)

A MESSAGE FROM FR. TOM

Dear Parish Family,

Let us continue to celebrate the 50 day season of Easter, Happy Easter. Today is Divine Mercy Sunday, a day filled with special graces and so from 3-6PM I will be gathered with other priests at Holy Child Church to participate in Divine Mercy Day. It was on this day 14 years ago that the Perpetual Adoration Chapel of Divine Mercy began. Ten years ago Pope St. John Paul the Great died on the vigil of this feast which he promoted and in which Pope Francis is taking up all next year as we celebrate, 2016, the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Jesus taught us, "Blessed are the merciful, they shall see God."

I want to thank all the sacristans, lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers, choir members, cantors, organists, R.C.I.A. team and candidates, ministers of Tenebrae, Mothers and Sons for the Stations of the Cross, and especially all the people of our parish for making this one of the most beautiful and memorable Holy Week's ever.

In the Church's Office of Readings this ancient homily was printed for Holy Saturday. It was read at Tenebrae and I have had several people ask for copies of it.

This is entitled, "The Lord's descent into hell"

Something strange is happening – there is a great silence on earth today, a great silence and stillness. The whole earth keeps silence because the King is asleep. The earth trembled and is still because God has fallen asleep in the flesh and has raised up all who have slept since the world began. God has died in the flesh and hell trembles in fear.

He has gone in search for our first parents, as for a lost sheep. Greatly desiring to visit those who live in the darkness and the shadow of death, he has gone to free from sorrow the captives Adam and Eve, he who is both God and the son of Eve. The Lord approached them bearing the cross, the weapon that had won them the victory. At the sight of him Adam, the first man he had created, struck his breast in terror and cried out, "My Lord be with you all." Christ answered him, "And with your spirit." He took him by the hand and raised him up saying: "Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead and Christ will give you light."

I am your God, who for your sake have become your son. Out of love for you and your descendants I now by my own authority command all who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are sleeping to arise. I order you, O sleeper to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of my hands, you who were created in my image. Rise, let us leave this place, for you are in me and I am in you; together we form only one person and we cannot be separated.

For your sake I, your God, became your son; I, the Lord, took the form of a slave; I, whose home is above the heavens, descended to the earth and beneath the earth. For you sake, for the sake of man, I became like a man without help, free among the dead. For the sake of you, who left a garden, I was betrayed in a garden, and I was crucified in a garden.

See on my face the spittle I received in order to restore to you the life I once breathed into you. See there the marks of the blows I receive in order to refashion your warped nature in my image. On my back see the marks of the scourging I endured to remove the burden of sin that weighs upon your back. See my hands, nailed firmly to a tree, for you who once wickedly stretched your hand to a tree.

I slept on the cross and a sword pierced my side for you who slept in paradise and brought forth Eve from your side. My side has healed the pain in yours. My sleep will rouse you from your sleep in hell. The sword that pierced me has sheathed the sword that turned against you.

Rise, let us leave this place. The enemy led you out of the earthly paradise. I will not restore you to that paradise, but I will enthrone you in heaven. I forbade you the tree that was only a symbol of life, but see, I who am life itself am now one with you. I appointed cherubim to guard you as slaves are guarded, but now I make them worship you as God. The throne formed by cherubim awaits you, its bearers swift and eager. The bridal chamber is adorned, the banquet is ready, the eternal dwelling place is prepared, the treasure houses of all good things lie open. The kingdom of heaven has been prepared for you from all eternity.

During the Easter Season, we will be inviting you to join in the campaign for the 2015 Cardinal's Appeal. BAPTISM PREPARATION POLICY

All Parish Families preparing for the Baptism of their child must attend the Parish Baptismal Preparation Program. The program is held mostly on the 2nd and 4th Sunday's of the month at 12 Noon in the Athletic Center (Damato Meeting Room). We invite you to bring along your baby's Godparents to hear this special presentation. Please call the rectory for a Registration Packet before attending the Sunday Meeting. A copy of the child's birth certificate is needed. The sponsor must have proof of Confirmation, a sponsor certificate (see sponsor certificate information below) and must be at least 14 years of age. The Baptismal donation of \$100 and the yellow registration form must be brought to the Parish Office (Mon.-Fri. 9 to 4PM), prior to the Baptism Meeting. You may then bring the completed registration form to the meeting of your choice.
