Saints Perpetua & Felicity - Martyrs, 203 A.D.

Perpetua was a prosperous young married woman with a newborn son from North Africa. At age 22, she, her servant Felicity, and several male companions were arrested for converting to Christianity. In her torments, Perpetua suffered fear of death, hunger, and separation from her child – the pain of swollen breasts. At her trial, the proconsul appealed to her sense of duty toward her aged father and infant son, she answered, "I am a Christian." In Christ, she found the power, freedom and courage to accept the consequences. She and her companions are condemned the terrifying sentence to fight wild beasts in the arena. Felicity, pregnant, gave birth the night before their martyrdom and was able to entrust her child to a Christian. The savage cow tossed them about with his horns. They survived and a swordsman was ordered to dispatch them. Being a novice, Perpetua had to direct the swordsman to her neck. The two women before being executed turned to one another and exchanged a sister in Christ kiss. (JM)

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family, (Alleluia, Jesus is Risen from the dead!)

Welcome to Divine Mercy Sunday! This too is a special feast within the Easter Season when we celebrate the mercy of Jesus and his appearance to Doubting Thomas, who cried out, "My Lord and My God". Jesus told Thomas, "Blessed are those who have not seen me but believe." Saint Faustina received revelations of the Lord that devotion to the merciful heart of Jesus would bring enormous graces to the world. For years it seemed that the "Chaplet of Divine Mercy" would go undiscovered, until Pope Saint John Paul II made this an official feast in the Church calendar. It is also interesting that it was in the twilight hours of this feast that Pope John Paul II died in 2005. The Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed on rosary beads. Beginning with the Apostles Creed and then an Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory be, starting with the Our Father Bead, the prayer begins, "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood of your Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins, and the sins of the whole world." Then on the Hail Mary beads, "For the sake of His sorrowful passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world." This chaplet prayer concludes three times, "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us." The image dedicated to the Divine Mercy shows Jesus pointing to His heart and two rays of light, one white and the other red flow, representing the water and blood He shed for us. Under the image of Jesus, is this inscription: "Jesus, I trust in you." This is the 15th anniversary of the Perpetual Adoration Chapel at Holy Child Church, where except for snowstorms, the Blessed Sacrament has been exposed 24/7 for 15 years. From 3PM until 5:30, there will a Divine Mercy Prayer Vigil and priests will be available during that time to celebrate during this extraordinary Jubilee, the Mercy of God. If you are free come and join us at Holy Child Church on April 3rd.

As I write this letter on Easter Monday, you will happy to note I slept for 12 hours in Easter Sunday Night. Holy Week was thrilling, draining and yet filled with so many moments of grace. I am aware of so many people who availed themselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Monday of Holy Week. Each of us four priests heard over 7 hours straight that day, and then again during the week and most especially of Good Friday. It probably is not an exaggeration to say that between the four priests here we heard a combined 40 hours of confessions. The devil must be hopping mad, but miracles do happen.

On what is the mother of all liturgies the Easter Vigil, it was a glorious time, in exactly two and one half hours we welcomed through the waters of baptism Afshin Michael Shirazi, Mary Ann Drane. We welcomed into full communion with our church, Karen Emigholz, Lianna Oveshalka, Alyssa Pivarnick. Then for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion and Confirmation, Eric Brennan, Cosimo Grimaldi, Michael Rivera, Marc Scott, Danielle Segarra and Gabrielle Marie Segarra. Also for the Sacrament of Confirmation we anointed Marina Cakaruglu, Lauren DiMaio, Christine Gorman, Andrew Russo, Melissa Simek-Lemos, Nicholas Sturiale. I want to thank the RCIA team for their preparation and for all who made that Easter Vigil so unforgettable.

I was delighted the Church so full for Easter Sunday. I am sorry for the chaos in the parking lot, given the huge numbers of people. But know you are all welcomed every weekend.

This morning the following reflection from a devotional book called "Jesus Calling" was so right on, I want to share it with you. March 28 -"I am a God who gives and gives and gives. When I died for you on the cross, I held nothing back: I poured out My Life like a drink offering. Because giving is inherent in my nature, I search for people who are able to receive in full measure. To increase your intimacy with Me, the two traits you need the most are receptivity and attentiveness. Receptivity is opening up your innermost being to be filled with my abundant riches. Attentiveness is directing your gaze into Me, searching for Me in all your moments. It is possible to stay your mind on Me, as the prophet Isaiah wrote. Through your attentiveness you receive a glorious gift: My perfect Peace."—Sarah Young

So what is coming down the pike in this month of April? Well next weekend I will be joining 14 others from New York for a Missionaries of the Poor mission to Kingston, Jamaica. During that time, we will welcome Father Franklin Odiaka, from Nigeria who will be a house guest. Please mark your calendars for THE PARISH MISSION, Monday through Thursday April 18-21 with the Dominican Friar and Sister, Father Jude Siciliano, OP, (born in Brooklyn) and Sister Pat Bruno, OP. During April, our second grade children from OLSS School and School of Religion will be receiving their First Holy Communion.

Today after all the Masses we welcome the Holy Land Artists and their sacred carvings of Olive wood religious articles on display in O'Mara Hall after all the Masses this weekend. They were crafted in Bethlehem and it is their chief means of support for their families back home. Please come and support them.

There have been 40 days of penance and sacrifice and fasting, but there are now in this Easter Season 50 days of celebration of the new life offered to us by the Resurrection of Christ.

May you be abundantly blessed this Easter season!
