Lent 2017

Fast & Abstinence: Good Friday, April 14th is a day of fast & abstinence. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 19-59. The Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat from 14 years onward.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Reconciliation Monday is Monday, April 10th from 3 pm to 9 pm in the church. There will also be confessions held in every church in the Archdiocese during this time. The last confessions before Easter will be on Good Friday, April 14th from 12 NOON to 2 PM.

Stations of the Cross: On Good Friday, April 14th, we will hold meditation on the Passion of Jesus Christ in word and song through the Eyes of His Mother Mary at 8 PM in the Church.

Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

A blessed Holy Week to all of you! I want to thank all the people who have helped making our Cluster Parish Mission a success, and most especially Father Victor Hoagland, CP. There was a wonderful turnout and I am grateful to my brother priests for their involvement and availability for the sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

You will have noticed that the Palm Sunday Mass schedule has been extended to handle the Mass crowds plus the Reading of the Passion. We began on Sunday Morning with the 7:30 AM, 9AM, 10:30AM, 12 Noon and 1:30PM and 7PM. It's my hope that after July 1st, the Sunday Schedule will be adjusted so that the parking lot will not be a zoo and that there will be a chance for people to leave Mass and arrive for the next Mass with a 90 minute time between liturgies. In July, the Mass schedule will be as follows: 8AM, 9:30AM, 11AM, 12:30PM and 7PM. There will be also be weekly baptisms at 2PM. We have a very large parish and so seeking to make life less stressful in the parking lot.

On Palm Sunday night after the 7PM Mass in O'Mara Hall there will be a showing of Mel Gibson's "The Passion of the Christ". I have heard from people that they found this too graphic, too violent and some were frankly afraid to watch this even alone at home. I know that the content is tough to watch. However, the Passion of Jesus was not pretty and the sacrifice of being with Christ in this visual and visceral depiction helped my focus on the depth of love with which Christ died for me. I hope this becomes part of our Holy Week prayer.

Holy Week has several components and I would like to highlight what they are. From sun down on Holy Thursday to sun down on Good Friday is day one. From sun down Good Friday to sun down Holy Saturday is day two. From sun down Holy Saturday to sun down Easter Sunday is day three. We call this in the liturgy of the Church the Paschal (Passover – Easter event) Triduum (Three Days). It is the most solemn and sacred time of our Church year.

At 9AM on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday, the Eucharistic Celebration will not be offered, but rather Tenebrae (Service of Light). The Tenebrae is basically the Morning Prayer and Office of Readings of the Church that is celebrated by priests, monks, nuns in the breviary, or Liturgy of the Hours. The extras involve the Candelabra of 15 candles that are extinguished after the psalm is read or the chanting of the readings from the Book of Lamentations. It takes approximately one hour and this sacred time helps start our day and prepare for the great events that will be celebrated later in the day.

The Holy Week Liturgy is actually one three day long Mass. On Holy Thursday at 8 PM, in a most solemn way we celebrate the night when Jesus instituted the priesthood and the Mass. There is the washing of the feet of 12 disciples. There is the procession after Mass to the Altar of Repose in O'Mara Hall where the Blessed Sacrament will be reserved and adoration will be held until midnight. The Church leaves in silence on Holy Thursday. The altar is stripped after Holy Thursday Mass.

On Good Friday, at 3 PM, the priests enter wearing Red Vestments in silence and solemnly prostrated themselves on the floor of the Sanctuary. There is an opening prayer, the readings recall the suffering and abandonment of Jesus at Calvary and the Passion of St. John's Gospel is read. There will be 10 specified intentions prayed for in the Universal Prayer, or Prayer of the Faithful. Then there will be the unveiling of the Cross, as the celebrant sings, "Behold the wood of the Cross, on which has hung the Savior of the World... Come let us worship". We will be then invited to venerate or kiss the Cross, while the choir sings. After the Lord's Prayer and Lamb of God is prayed, the deacon will carry the Blessed Sacrament back into the church for the distribution of Holy Eucharist. There will be a concluding prayer and the priests will leave once again in silence.

On Good Friday evening at 8 PM, there will be a special Stations of the Cross, presented by the Mothers and Sons of our parish, and hosted by the Religious Education. Once again, all are invited to participate.

Following Saturday Tenebrae, there will be flurry of sacristans to prepare for the mother of all liturgies at 8 PM, the Easter Vigil Mass, which is approximately 3 hours long. There are 5 great movements of the Mass: Part 1 is The Blessing of the Easter Fire and the carrying of the Easter Paschal Candle into the Church and the singing of the Easter Proclamation, The Exultet. Part 2, The 5 readings of the Old Testament highlighting Salvation History and then the singing of the Gloria. There will be a solemn procession with Alleluia's to the Risen Christ and the Gospel. I will preach the Homily. Part 3 is the Liturgy of Baptism, Confirmation, and reception into fullness of communion for all our Elect and RCIA candidates. Part 4 is the renewal of the Church Baptismal Promises and sprinkling with the Holy Water. Part 5 is the Liturgy of the Eucharist with our newly received elect and candidates reception of Holy Communion for the first time. It is a glorious night filled with joy and music and faith.

Many people understandably can't join us for all but even you can make part of the Holy Week liturgies. Each and every one of them a facet of the diamond and precious jewel our faith is in the Risen Lord Jesus. May God bless you all!

We join with the whole world proclaiming, "Jesus is Risen!", and our response, "Indeed He is Risen".

All students currently attending our program have received re-registration forms during the month of April. Please return the forms to your child's teacher or mail to the Religious Education office **before May 18, 2017** to take advantage of our reduced rates. Anyone needing evening classes must return their re-registration form no later than **May 4, 2017**.

Please bring the following required documents to registration:

- We must see your child's Baptismal Certificate.
- A statement (transcript) of all prior Religious Education if the student is beyond first grade in public school.
- First Holy Communion & Penance Certificate, if the sacrament has already been received.

Registration fees BEFORE May 18, 2017 are:

Day Sessions: \$225 for one child; \$300 for two or more children
 Wednesday Evenings: \$275 for one child; \$375 for 2 or more children

Registration fees AFTER May 18, 2017 are:

Day Sessions: \$275 for one child and \$350 for two or more
 Wednesday Evenings: \$325 for one child; \$425 for two or more
