Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family, I found this article from Father Vlado Bizjak entitled "Spiritual Growth and Disappointment," something worthwhile to ponder.

"One contemporary social myth is to be successful, anytime and everywhere. Politicians have to be perfect or they have to resign, products must work perfectly or business crashes; children must not disappoint their parents – they have to meet all their expectations. In our country it is not so rare to learn of the case that an adolescent kill himself as a result of feeling like a failure before his family. He cannot accept or bear the burden of disappointment.

Then it is the Church. Also she must be perfect, especially bishops and priests, they should not disappoint the world who wants and needs and example of holiness. Maybe we Catholics, as children of our time, also infected with this virus in the way we look on our spiritual and everyday life. We know about the pressure to be good and to be successful in the eyes of our parents, relatives, neighbors, priests and bishops.

Every human being is and has first to be fascinated. Animals cannot do it, they cannot admire, wonder and be fascinated. Man can and should do it. Some say that wondering is the beginning of philosophy. A child admires the almightiness of his parents. They are ideal and represent the ideal world. They teach him to be good, virtuous, successful and holy. At first he doesn't distinguish between illusion and fantasy. Maybe it's the child's first disappointment when he realizes that Santa isn't real.

Later on people are fascinated many times, by a wonderful experience of traveling or of pilgrimage, by knowing a new inspiring man or woman who they want to follow or be their friend. When someone falls in love, he is fascinated by the other. A boy loses his mind, his girl loses hers as well, he is then her Prince Charming. Their brain produces an image of a perfect man or woman with whom they are ready not only to spend their entire life, but also die for. Anyhow, they will be quite happy with their person for their entire life and there is nothing imperfect in this human being.

Why then are some people too excited and too fascinated? There are many reasons. A reason behind can be dissatisfaction with themselves, bad self-image, weak and unstable identity. Feelings of their own weakness or incapacity pushed them to search for an ideal solution or promise outside. All their hopes and dreams are idealized in a perfect image, created by their own. Common sense or not, reason has no effect. There is an ideal other person (partner, brother, saint, bishop or God) or an ideal possession (money, miracle) that can solve all problems with an ease.

When fascination passes – and this, as a rule, happens every time – people are like woken up from a dream. If until now nobody or nothing has disappointed us, maybe we are still in a dream of childish idealization. The battle to grow spiritually and personally still didn't begin. Only what fascinated us first, can really disappoint us. Something what we hoped in and what we idealized. Soap bubble of perfect produced in our mind bursts and rainbow colors end up in a drop on the floor.

Disappointment comes as a rule, because of rational thinking. Fascination is mostly irrational an emotional thing. Reason helps us to see that our ideals are relative, not absolute. Objects of our idealization don't solve our problems as we expected. We realize that we expected from something or someone things that he or she cannot give. This experience is hard, but very necessary.

We have to be skeptics in front of over exaggerated idealizations. Our world is not black and white and neither are people. There is no perfect saint or perfect sinner. There is one ideal alone –God. But even God can disappoint us. Not because He is not perfect, but because we have a distorted image of Him and eventually He doesn't act as we idealistically want or hope.

Everything we have hope in has to disappoint us, even God! It is a necessary step in our spiritual life. There is no spiritual growth outside of the paschal mystery. And this paschal mystery passes, as we know, the passion and death. Only then the resurrection comes. There is not resurrection without death and in the same way disappointments have to come along the way for everything that fascinated us.

We have to be disappointed by the things we love the most. First, we are disappointed with our parents, friends, and other close people or those that we count on, our authorities, bishops, judges and politicians. We have to be in a way disappointed also by the Church, by the priesthood, by different pastoral approaches we counted on. Finally, the hardest one is to be disappointed by God and faith.

Pope Emeritus Benedict VXI speaks about politics. One of the important roles of Christianity as separated from the state and politics is to demythologize politics. The state and politics can quickly bet attributes of omnipotence and promise the impossible. People love to believe in a better future. Christianity sobers down politics and it shows, that we cannot expect too much from this world.

Finally, disappointment for man is God (Jesus) Himself. Many people leave the faith because they have too idealistic of expectations from it. As soon as he stops fulfilling all their desires, they turn away. In the Bible itself, we can find many bitter disappointments, even Jesus' closest friends were tempted. Many wonder over Jesus' remaining behind in the Temple: "Son why have you done this to us?" Judas in his disappointment betrays Jesus and then, disappointed by himself and his sin, commits suicide. Peter, disappointed by Jesus speaking about his suffering, wants to stop him and finally ends up denying him and in so disappointed himself. Many disciples, disappointed by Jesus speaking of the Eucharist, were grumbling and turned their backs on him. The cross was the final of Jesus' disappointment for all, only few people were left on Calvary.

The Cross, the disappointment, surely doesn't have to be the final word as it is not in the paschal mystery. But sadly, many people stay there for the rest of their lives. Once disappointed they lose their faith and live in bitterness. This is the biggest mistake ever. We have to understand that disappointments must come as a step in our growth toward a full spiritual and human maturity. It is nothing with being disappointed. It is meant so. And it is meant to learn from such experience. We are still tempted to leave God, priesthood, parish life because we are disappointed. But we are called to grow up. Some of us are more prone to idealism and live in the clouds; others are hard realists without any faith. We need to put together the emotional power of fascination and rational sober reality of life. We have to stop swinging between them.

Fascination is a gift. It gives us many beautiful experiences, peoples, feelings of being accepted and gifted. We have to be fascinated, emotionally fulfilled. This a good and necessary legacy for hard times. Disappointments are also gifts, helping us to stay sober and rational. If we learn how to live in balance and acceptance of both we will find Easter morning, the completion of the Paschal Mystery and a new step in our spiritual maturity".

I know this is deep and I thank you for hanging in there to read this.

Finally, in our first 1:15 PM Sunday Mass on September 11th we will have the Blessing of Backpacks for all students returning to school. If you would like to have a special blessing on this school year for your children, please attend and bring your backpack.

- *Thursday, September 8 is a full day for students in grades 1-8.

- *All students must be in complete summer uniforms.
- *Bus service will be available for children in grades 1-8.
