

Dear Parish Family,

Happy New Year! May 2016 be a year filled with Extraordinary Jubilee Graces of Mercy. Pope Francis is leading our Church deeper into the mystery of God's love for us.

I received a wonderful Christmas interpretation of First Corinthians 13, this is timely and usually read at weddings as the second reading.

1st Corinthians 13

- -If I decorate my house perfectly with plaid bows, strands of twinkling lights and shiny balls, but do not show love. I am just another decorator.
- -If I slave away in the kitchen, baking dozens of Christmas cookies, preparing gourmet meals and arranging a beautifully adorned table at mealtime, but do not show love, I'm just another cook.
- -If I work in a soup kitchen, carol in the nursing home and give all that I have to charity, but do not show love, it profits me nothing.
- -If I trim the spruce tree with shimmering angels and crocheted snowflakes, attend a myriad of holiday parties and sing in the choir's cantata but do not focus on Christ. I have missed the point.
- -Love stops the cooking to hug the child. Love sets aside the decorating to the husband. Love is kind, though harried and tired.
- -Love doesn't envy another's home that has coordinated Christmas china and linens.
- -Love doesn't yell at the kids to get out of the way, but is thankful they are there to be in the way.
- -Love doesn't give only to those who are able to give in return but rejoices in giving to those who can't.
- -Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, and endures all things. Love never fails. Video games will break, pearl necklaces will be lost, golf clubs will rust, but the gift of love will endure forever.

The Special Meaning of the Twelve Days of Christmas - Today the cost of all the items of the twelve days of Christmas would be around \$28,000. The truth is that each and every one of us, as followers of Christ, have already received this extravagant gift. "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written in England during a period when Catholics were banned from practicing their faith in any form – public or private. In fact, from 1558 to 1829, it was a crime to be Catholic in England. If discovered, the punishments were severe and ranged from imprisonment to torture to death. According to the legend, "The Twelve Days of Christmas" was written to help young Catholics to learn the tenets of their faith.

This song's gifts are secret codes which represent the teachings of the Catholic faith. When we hear "On the first day of Christmas, my true love gave to me," "true Love" does not mean a lovesick boyfriend or girlfriend, but rather God Himself. "Me" the person receiving the gift, is every baptized person.

- 1. The Partridge in the pear tree symbolized Jesus Christ which is why this gift is received on the first day of Christmas the birth of our Lord and Savior. Truly, this is the gift of love. The partridge is a bird willing to sacrifice its life, if necessary, to protect its young by pretending to be injured to draw away predators.
- 2. Two Turtle doves represent the Old and New Testament
- 3. Three French hens stand for the theological virtues of Faith, Hope and Love.
- 4. Four calling birds signify the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- 5. Five Golden Rings are meant to be the first five books of the Bible, which provides the history of man's fall from grace and the great of love of God in sending a Savior.
- 6. Six geese a laying represent the six days of creation.
- 7. Seven swans a swimming are the seven Sacraments, gifts of the Holy Spirit. Wisdom, Understanding, Fortitude, Counsel, Knowledge, Piety, Awe of God.
- 8. Eight maids a milking reflect the eight beatitudes.
- 9. Nine ladies dancing refer to the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Goodness or Kindness, Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Chastity.
- 10. Ten lords a leaping stand for the 10 Commandments.
- 11. Eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful disciples.
- 12. Twelve drummers drumming are the twelve points of the doctrine in the Apostle's Creed.

This Christmas Season and New Year, let us remember the great gifts we have already received: our faith and salvation through the Lord, Jesus Christ.
