A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Summertime is a wonderful time to socialize and meet new and interesting people. Last Saturday I was introduced to Louis Masi. Louis is a seminarian serving at Saint Joseph & Saint Thomas, Saint John Neumann Parish. He is returning at the end of August to the Pontifical North American College in Vatican City and at the end of September he will be ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop James Checcio of Metuchen Diocese, the former rector of that seminary. Lou hails originally from Saint Theresa of the Child Jesus Parish, in the Pelham Bay section of the Bronx. His parents were born in Mola di Bari and he went to Regis High School, Fordham University and now in Rome he studied in the Gregorianum (Jesuit) and the Augustinium Colleges in Rome. His concentration will be studying Patristics-the Early Church Fathers after the Apostles. He will be ordained a priest next May with 5 other classmates studying in New York. I was inspired to listen to this young seminarian speak of his experiences. While he was speaking, I was thinking about our own Anthony Gorgia and his first days in Rome. Anthony left last Tuesday evening for Assisi, to learn Italian. Please keep his family in your prayers. Between seminarians and priests, there are 12 New Yorkers studying theology in Rome this year. Anthony won't be among strangers.

While Father Dave, Carmine Caruso and I dined at Portobello Café with Lou; he mentioned that he had spent one month with Maryknoll Fathers in China. This was a very remote part of China. It's where North Korea, China and Russia almost meet. The village to which he was sent was in need for people to teach English, so he went. The young people never heard about Jesus, or the Catholic Church or faith, and there were strict laws about evangelizing and spreading the faith. So Lou had to be cautious but he could answer questions. For example, Louis mentioned that in December there is a major holiday that many Americans gather to exchange gifts call Christmas. He could mention this but not go into any details. What seemed to fascinate his students was the issue of celibacy. Inquiring minds wanted to know, was he married? Did he have a wife and children? When he said no, they wanted to know more about what does it mean to give up your life and live celibacy? They got the idea that this must mean something absolutely important, "To give up your life for a specific purpose", they wanted to know more. Lou was directing them to keep asking questions and when he was gone, to speak with the Maryknoll Missioners still living in the region. It fascinated Lou to discover that in a land where the name of Jesus is never mentioned, or Church or symbols of faith are not present, there was such a hunger for God. It seems to ask the question down deep, are we not hard wired to want to know and understand more about God? Why am I here, how did I get here, what is my purpose in life? It was an interesting conversation.

At one point in our talk, Lou mentioned about a woman who came to him after class and very secretly showed him her medal that she was wearing under her clothes. It was an image of Our Blessed Mother. She invited him to come to the State Run Catholic Church and she arrived early and prayed the rosary before Mass, she attended the Mass but did not receive Holy Communion. She told Lou that she have been going every week for over a year. When Lou asked her if she had been baptized, she replied that she did not know what "Baptism" meant. She was attracted to the Mass, the people praying and the peace she felt. Lou again invited her to speak with the Maryknoll Fathers after he left.

In today's gospel, we are told that if we had the faith of a mustard seed we could move mountains, and uproot mustard seed bushes. All is possible with faith. There are so many young people in China who don't know about Jesus. While we still have the freedom to mention Jesus' name in public, let us not bypass the opportunity to give witness. The world is starving for God; His love, His mercy, His freedom when he delivers us from our fears and sins, He's glorified when we shine with his inner peace, all these are gifts to create faith and re-create our lives. It is good to speak and give a testimony to the power of God at work in us. Lou in his humble gentle way brought Christ to China and Calcutta. Between Caesar salads and the key lime pie, I learned a lot and am grateful to the next generation and their dedication to Christ.
