**St. Stephen the Younger – Monk and Martyr – Nov. 28**

Stephen was born in Constantinople in 714. At 15, he entered Mt. St. Augustus Monastery – he was in charge of obtaining the daily provisions. When his father died, Stephen sold his inheritance and distributed the proceeds to the poor. At age 30, he became Abbot, but after 12 years, resigned to live in and out of the cell to have more solitude. At that time, Emperor Constantine Copronymus was obsessed with stamping out sacred images in the Church. St. Stephen refused to go against Church teaching. He was then subjected to much pressure, including exile and false accusations. He trusted in God and reiterated the good that sacred images do for all members. At length, the saint was clubbed to death in 764. (JM)

## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Today is the first Sunday in Advent, a new liturgical season. We are invited on the journey from Paradise to Bethlehem. Once Adam and Eve were kicked out of paradise every generation of people have been searching how to get back to paradise. This is a journey in faith. Normally during this very busy season we are distracted with everything from Black Friday shopping to on line ordering to last minute running to the Mall for something for everyone. Yet there is one thing we all need. Jesus came into the world as a baby, so that we wouldn't be afraid of a baby but not as a King, or a warrior Messiah, or royal emperor, but no, Jesus is a savior. The program is held mostly on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday's of the month at 12 Noon in the Athletic Center (Damato Meeting Room). We invite you to bring along your baby's Godparents to hear this special presentation. Please call the rectory for a Registration Packet before attending the Sunday Meeting. A copy of the child's birth certificate is needed. The sponsor must have proof of Confirmation, a sponsor certificate (see sponsor certificate information below) and must be at least 14 years of age. The Baptismal donation of \$100 and the yellow registration form must be brought to the Parish Office (Mon.- Fri. 9 to 4PM), prior to the Baptism Meeting. You may then bring the completed registration form to the meeting of your choice.

### A MESSAGE FROM THE POLICE DEPT.

With the holiday season upon us, most people are preoccupied with the details of holiday plans and shopping. Unfortunately, our normal safety precautions are sometimes forgotten, or the excitement of the season causes us to let down our guard. The Police Department reminds us to be alert and aware of our surroundings at all times; travel on populated, well-lit streets and if possible travel with a friend; drive with doors locked, windows closed and a full tank of gas; know how to get to your destination by the most direct and safest route; a green light at a subway entrance means you can enter the subway at that location – a red light means you can't enter; plan your purchases in advance and carry only the amount of cash necessary to make the purchase and remember to record the numbers for each of the credit cards you own. This will facilitate reporting the theft or loss of the card.
