# <u>Pastor's Letter</u>

#### Dear Parish Family,

I want to take this opportunity to thank His Eminence Cardinal Dolan and Bishop John O'Hara, Monsignor Peter Finn, our Regional Vicar, Monsignor Jeffrey Conway and my brother priests who were formerly assigned here and our elected officials, Ron Castorino, Joseph Borelli and Michael Cusick for helping us celebrate our 100<sup>th</sup> Jubilee last Sunday at the 2pm Eucharist. It was a joyous event filled with gladness to Almighty God for all the blessings that have been and will continue to be showered upon us in the Jubilee Year. In the Old Testament, a jubilee was called for every 50 years; there was to be expected an extraordinary bumper crop, such that one could literally rest from all work for that year and also there was called forth from the people a forgiveness of all broken relationships, a forgiveness of debt, the release of prisoners as a sign of God's merciful blessing upon all the people. Jubilee was called for a special time of rejocing. This Sunday evening at the Hilton we will do just that at our Jubilee Gala Dinner-Dance. Once again I want to thank all the people who have prepared for this special time and all the hard work in making things run seamlessly.

This is also a time to remember that we are coincidentally, in the final stages of our Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy called forth by Pope Francis. If you haven't had the opportunity to experience God's special graces in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, please do so before the end of November when this extraordinary Jubilee will conclude on the Feast of Christ the King. We have been invited to walk through the Doors of Mercy that have been designated for this event. In fact, two busloads of people from our Cluster Parishes attended a special gratering at Regina Pacis Church in Brooklyn, and not only did they walk through the Door of Mercy but visited one of most beautiful minor basilicas in our country. Also, you can walk through the Door of Mercy located at Old Saint Patrick's Cathedral in Manhattan, St. Patrick's Cathedral, the Shrine of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, The Marian Shrine of Don Bosco in Haverstraw, and the Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Middletown, New York. If you haven't had the chance thus far, please do so, there are special graces for all who freely choose to participate.

Amidst all this celebration and rejoicing I am keenly aware of the sorrow and grief being felt throughout our parish over the recent passing of Baby Summer Semerad, Jack Sofia, and Stephen Pinto. All these people were young and went home to God suddenly, and the prayers and pain felt by many who prayed, touches us all deeply. There are no words when we come to these moments of life. We are speechless and it's appropriate to feel anger, disappointment, sorrow and deep sadness as we join with their families in profound grief. However, as deep and as real as that is, so too is our underlying faith that God hears our lamentations and loud cries and tears. He cries with us from the Cross and reminds us that death is not the last word - there is Resurrection and Redemption that will one-day overturn our pain. Christ's shoulders are broad enough to handle our tears and fears. I am praying for that peace that passes understanding so that one day we can say, "Jesus I trust in you".

In good times and in bad, we can always turn to our Blessed Mother and ask for her help. This is October, the month of the Holy Rosary. We have 20 decades to meditate on: 5 for sorrow, 10 for joy and 5 for light. Father Patrick Peyton always said, "The Family that prays together, stays together". I strongly urge you to pray the rosary. Just in case you may have forgotten the mysteries to meditate on, here they are.

<u>The Joyful Mysteries</u>: The Annunciation, The Visitation, The Nativity, The Presentation in the Temple, The finding of the child Jesus in the Temple.

<u>The Luminous Mysteries</u>: The Baptism of the Lord, The Wedding Feast of Cana, The Call of the Kingdom with its call to conversion, The Transfiguration, The Institution of the Eucharist as the Sign of the Paschal Mystery.

The Sorrowful Mysteries: The Agony in the Garden, The Scourging at the Pillar, The Crowning with Thorns, The Carrying of the Cross, and The Crucifixion of Our Lord.

<u>The Glorious Mysteries</u>: The Resurrection, The Ascension, Pentecost, The Assumption of Mary into Heaven, The Crowning of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth.


