**St. Anthony Mary Claret, 1807-1870 – October 24**

St. Anthony Mary Claret was the founder of the Clareton order, and as the Archbishop of Cuba was very busy. He wrote more than 140 books, preached over 25,000 sermons, confirmed over 100,000 people and was confessor to Queen Isabella II of Spain for eight years. He built a science laboratory, a natural history museum, and schools of music and education. Despite his heavy workload, he always had his rosary in his hand. As a young man in his father's weaving business, he encouraged workers to pray the rosary and attend daily mass. He did not cut their pay for time spent in prayer, and soon the shop was prospering. This is known as the "Prayer Principle". The time spent in prayer is never lost; it will always be returned to you – and then some. -JM

## Pastor's Letter

Dear Parish Family,

**The Infinite Value of Holy Mass** is a good reflection of our worship.

“The Holy Mass is the highest form of worship. It is the sacrifice of Calvary renewed. One Mass gives God more praise and thanksgiving, makes more atonement for sin, and pleads more eloquently than does the combined and eternal worship of all the souls in heaven, and on earth and in purgatory. In the Holy Mass, it is Jesus Christ, God as well as Man, who is our Intercessor, our Priest and our Victim. Being God—as well as Man—His prayers, merits, and His offerings are infinite in value.”

**Why should we attend Holy Mass?** The Mass is the best means we have to render God the highest form of worship, to thank Him for all His blessings, to make reparation for all our sins, to obtain all the blessings we desire, to release souls from purgatory and to shorten our own time there, to preserve us from all dangers of body and soul; to be consoled at the hour of death, for at that moment their memory will be our greatest consolation; and to better understand the sublimity of the Passion of Christ and therefore, to increase our love for him.

**How to participate at Holy Mass:** It is a common practice to limit our prayers to petitions. This is a mistake. We owe God, first of all, adoration, secondly, gratitude. We can never thank Him sufficiently, even if we were to employ eternity in so doing for the innumerable gifts, material and spiritual, temporal and eternal which He bestows upon us. Life, redemption, our Catholic faith, preservation from grave sin, the grace of conversion, health relatives and friends—these are but a few of God's gifts. Let us rejoice, therefore, to thank God by means of the Holy Mass. After adoration and thanksgiving, comes atonement. Prostrate at the foot of Calvary's cross, down which the most precious Blood of Jesus Christ flows from His gaping wounds, we should beg pardon for our sins, which have thus nailed Jesus to the cross. Let us ask Him to pour His Precious Blood over our souls that they may be cleansed from their polluting stains. Prayers of petition should not be forgotten. In it, we beg God for the favors which we stand in need.

### **The Infinite Value of the Eucharist from the Catechism of the Catholic Church**

**CCC#1324** The Eucharist is “the source and summit of the Christian life.” “The other Sacraments and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself, our Passover.”

**CCC#1325** The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the people of God by which the Church is kept in being. It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and the worship men offer to Christ and through Him to the Father in the Holy Spirit.

**CCC#1326** By the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all.

**CCC#1362** The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the making present and the sacramental offering of His unique sacrifice, in the liturgy of the Church which is His Body. In all the Eucharistic prayers we find, after the words of institution, a prayer called the anamnesis or memorial.

**CCC#1363** In the sense of the Sacred Scriptures, the memorial is not merely the recollection of past events, but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become in a certain way present and real. This is how Israel understands the liberation from Egypt every time Passover is celebrated. The Exodus events are made present to the memory of believers so that they may conform their lives to them.

**CCC#1364** In the New Testament, the memorial takes on new meaning. When the Church addresses the Eucharist, she commemorates Christ's Passover, and it is made present—the sacrifice Christ offered once for all on the cross remains ever present. “As often as the sacrifice of the cross by which Christ our Pasch has been sanctified is celebrated on the altar the work of our redemption is carried out.”

**CCC#1365** Because it is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the Eucharist is also a sacrifice. The sacrificial character of the Eucharist is manifested in the very words of institution. “This is My Body which is given up for you” and “This cup which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in My Blood.” In the Eucharist, Christ gives us the very body which He gave up for us on the cross, the very blood which He “poured out for the many for the forgiveness of sins.”

**CCC#1366** The Eucharist is this a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross. Because it is its memorial and because it applies its fruit; Christ our Lord and God, was once and for all to offer Himself to God the Father by His death on the altar of the cross, to accomplish there an everlasting redemption. But because His priesthood was not to end with His death, at the Last Supper, “on the night when He was betrayed.” (He wanted) to leave to His beloved spouse the Church a visible sacrifice (as the nature of man demands) by which the bloody sacrifice which He was to accomplish once and for all on the cross would be re-presented, its memory perpetuated until the end of the world, and its salutary power be applied to the forgiveness of sins we daily commit.”

**Morning Offering:** O Jesus in union with your most Precious Blood, poured out upon the Cross, and offered at every Mass, I offer you all my prayers, works, joys, sorrows and sufferings, for the praise of your Holy Name, all the desires of your Sacred Heart, the reparation of sin, the conversion of unbelievers, the unions of all Christians and our final union with you in Heaven. “

## Marian Consecration at OLSS

OLSS is offering a chance for parishioners to consecrate themselves to the Blessed Virgin Mary according to the consecration of St. Louis de Montfort.

Marian Consecration involves the surrender of one's life to the Blessed Virgin Mary through a prayer of consecration, preceded by 33 days of preparation and prayer. St. Louis de Montfort called consecration to Mary the "surest, easiest, shortest, and most perfect" way to go to Jesus and become a saint. Pope John Paul II said that consecration to Mary was a "decisive turning point" in his own spiritual life.

Fr. David will lead all who are interested in the consecration. There will be an introductory meeting on **Friday, Nov. 4 at 6:30 pm** in the Church. Prayers of preparation will be done on the individual's own time at home, and those participating will perform the consecration **following the 8 pm Mass on Thursday, Dec. 8**, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The text being used for the preparation for the consecration is **33 Days to Morning Glory**, by Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC. **This book is required for the consecration, and each participant must have a copy by November 5<sup>th</sup>.** It is available at Alba House, Amazon, or Barnes & Noble.
