A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

A blessed and happy Thanksgiving Weekend. It's always wonderful to gather with the entire family and make memories over this holiday weekend. It is also the First Week of Advent, where we come as a church family and prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. Jesus comes to us in *History, Mystery and Majesty*. Advent reminds us that there is still a need for a Savior to be born again in our lives. Amid the hustle and bustle of getting ready for Christmas, we make room in our hearts each day for Christ to come and be born in us.

I read recently in *The Word Among Us* magazine about the conversion of Sister Theresa Alethia, FSP, (Daughter of Saint Paul) from atheist to Catholicism and about her eventual entry into a convent. When she was in college, she mentioned to her friend, who sat next to her in the orchestra, that she was an atheist. She was shocked to hear her reply, "I'm so sad, because to deny God is to end up in hell, there's no hope for you." Although it was shocking to her and may have ended her relationship, she did ask herself some deep questions, such as 'where am I going in life,' and 'what is the purpose of life.' Someone told her that some of the saints had the practice of Memento Mori, (remembering your own death), and even having a replica of a skull on their desk. She said that this practice lead her to examine her own conscience and all the conversations and deeds of each day. The Jesuits promoted this *examen* as a spiritual practice. This gradually began the journey to seek entrance in the Catholic Church for Sister Theresa Alethia.

Advent is a time of conversion, a change of heart and mind and attitude. Perhaps the world is getting more frightening with all the focus on corruption and impeachment hearings, violence in the mall and in quiet neighborhoods, innocent people getting shot in schools, workplaces and at home. It is precisely into this world Jesus comes to be for us the Way, the Truth and the Life. From the wood of the Manger, to the work bench of Saint Joseph's carpenter's shop, to the wood of the Cross, Jesus was adored, handled, worked and eventually chose to lay down His life to save us. Every day at Mass, we offer His sacrifice as the greatest prayer the Church has, so as to become peaceful, confident and loving. Please make every effort to keep Advent holy, with your prayer time, your deeds of charity and our mission to welcome people home to Christ for Christmas.

I have been encouraged these last several days with the example of our young people. The Star players sang and danced and acted in such a way that they reminded us of the joy to the Christmas Season. Students just before Thanksgiving at Notre Dame Academy were installed as extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist. All the men of our Holy Name Society along with their helpmates have drilled rebar and hoisted our Parish Memorial Christmas trees in place. This process continues with the stringing of lights. There is the Boy Scouts' and Cub Scouts' Food Pantry drive, when just before Thanksgiving they collected and helped to deliver to the Saint Edward Food Pantry. Project Hospitality held their Poor People's Supper at the Hilton Hotel and many young people from all our Archdiocesan Schools attended and listened to the words of speakers informing us about homelessness on Staten Island and the effort of all the faith's houses of worship to alleviate this problem and support this worthy cause.

I first of all want to give thanks for the volunteers and parishioners who have most generously contributed \$1.74 million towards the Renew and Rebuild Campaign. As I have mentioned, we are concluding this Archdiocesan Capital Campaign. We are still collecting and hoping to reach the respectable 85% of our goal. \$1.73 million out of the \$2.1 million has been pledged. Thank you for all who have been so generous. I am deeply appreciative of this sacrifice.

In Sara Young's book, "Jesus Calling", she writes for November 20th:

I AM PLEASED WITH YOU, MY CHILD. Allow yourself to become more fully aware of MY pleasure shining upon you. You don't have to perform well in order to receive MY LOVE. In fact, a performance focus will pull you away from Me, toward some form of Pharisaism. This can be a subtle form of idolatry: worshipping your own good works. It can be a source of deep discouragement when your works don't measure up to your expectations.

Shift your focus from performance to MY RADIANT PRESENCE. The Light of MY Love shines in you continually, regardless of your feelings or behavior. Your responsibility is to be receptive to this unconditional Love. Thankfulness and trust is your primary receptors. Thank Me for everything, trust in Me at all times. This simple discipline will keep you open to MY LOVING PRESENCE. (Ephesians 2: 8-9; Ephesians 3: 16-19; Psalm 62:8).

I will remember you all in my prayers for a fruitful and blessed Advent.
