A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

A blessed Christmas Season to all of you! I am sure that you are as relieved as I am that we made it this far. Christmas is a time for us now to **Stop, Look and Give Thanks**. First of all, when I perceive all the running around that we do in preparation, it's amazing how much we accomplish in such a small amount of time. I remember and suspect that it's still the same with college students, who are cramming for final exams, and haven't begun to shop for Christmas. They may have found themselves in the zone of being unable to order online presents in time; and having to go to the stores at the last minute. I think of all the Christmas pageants and the wonderful voices of the little ones, who belt out Christmas tunes with glee. I see how parents and grandparents rush to get to these concerts on time. Then there's the office parties and tons of food and drink. How many times have we found ourselves saying; now all I need is those Christmas Bags, and so, you run out buy simple stuff like scotch tape, labels, tissue paper and wrapping paper only to discover that Five Below and Dollar Stores are just as crowded as anyplace else, with only two cashiers and lines as long as the LIE. We rush home, get the wrapping done, the assembling of the gifts under the tree done and now that Christmas is over it's time to **STOP**. If you're like me you'll probably swear that next year, 'I'll shop earlier and work smarter, not harder.'

Let us turn to the Christmas Story. It seems that things weren't much different. It is better for me to focus on changing myself than to worry about changing other people, as you no doubt remember me saying, I can't change anyway.

Finally, give me the wisdom to just shut up whenever I think that I'm clearly smarter than everyone else in the room, that no one knows what they're talking about except me, or that I alone have all the answers.

Basically, God grant me the wisdom to remember that I'm not you. AMEN"

So, we need to STOP, LOOK and GIVE THANKS this Christmas season.

Next week turn the page on a new decade: 2020. What are some of the things I am looking forward to? Well, on March 16-19, we will welcome back from Rome, Father Joseph Roesch, MIC. 
