A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

On this President's weekend, I write to thank you for your most loving kindness and generosity to the Missionaries of the Poor. Father Henry Lozano, MOP and Brother Francis, MOP joined us for four days and they are returning to their respective mission assignments in Naga, Philippines and East Timor. It's amazing how far reaching planes can go from JFK. Brother Francis was the first to fly from JFK to Doha and from Doha to Indonesia and from Indonesia to East Timor and then have a four-hour drive on rough mountain roads to his mission. Flying on Qatar Airways, he flew east. Father Henry left at 1am on Wednesday morning and 16 hours later he will arrive in Manila on Thursday morning with Philippines Airlines. He flew West. So spanning the globe these missionaries travel to care for the poorest of the poor with joy of the Gospel and the compassion of Christ crucified. Prior to coming to Our Lady Star of the Sea, they were both at their motherhouse Monastery in Kingston. I mentioned about your generosity, and indeed, they were delighted with a little more than \$10,000 they collected. I had the opportunity to drive them both for a night-time tour of Manhattan. We visited Saint Patrick's Cathedral, then past Radio City and down Broadway into the bright lights and turning left we headed south past Greenwich Village, past Ground Zero and the Freedom Tower into the Hugh Carey Tunnel, through Brooklyn and back home. Although it was misty and traffic wasn't too bad, the awesomeness of New York left an impression upon them.

We certainly have our political differences of opinions, however we are vastly different than the tensions of the politics in other countries, where the missionaries serve. For being outspoken and no freedom of speech, one could be systemically arrested, imprisoned and tortured for maintaining the faith. It was during last Sunday, that I learned that people who are suffering from the Coronavirus, who are close to death are targets in some cases for euthanasia, or "mercy killings". We pray for all persecuted Christians throughout the world.

This past week it has been difficult to say goodbye to several wonderful people who have been called home by God. I attended the funeral of Mary Bonfiglio, where her son, Deacon Sal Bonfiglio, gave a beautiful homily to his family and gathered friends. Her daughter Julia is very active in the Catholic Daughters of America and not only sings with our choir at the 11AM Mass each Sunday, but also ministers as one of our parish lectors.

Terry Zizzamia, also went home to the Lord, after suffering so much in her life. Tragically, her son's home on Rensselaer Avenue and Huguenot Avenue was among the 8 homes that were set ablaze in that awful fire, two weeks ago. Terry had long been a catechist in our parish and most recently the director of the "50 Plus Senior Club" where they enjoyed their gatherings and trips. She was a giver and an organizer and had great faith, may she rest in peace.

Finally, Doris Gillis, a member of Holy Child Parish, was with her daughter, Sister Margaret Michael Gillis, of the Daughters of Saint Paul at the moment of her passing into the loving arms of God. She was a real character. She grew up in an orphanage with the Good Shepherd Sisters and eventually became a nurse. She had tremendous faith and a heart for single people who had nowhere to go for holiday celebrations. She cooked for many of these folks and invited them to a feast in her home. I enjoyed the pamphlet photo of her with two bundles in her arms, loaves of Italian bread and a bouquet of roses. I was honored to preach the Gospel at her funeral Mass last Tuesday. When Sister Meg gave the eulogy, I resonated with her comment. "I know that when Mom met Jesus, she probably asked Him, 'Can I have this dance!" During my time at Holy Child, Elaina Pecora, who was our Principal of Pre-School, would also gather scores of people to rehearse and perform an annual Dinner Theatre Event. My brother and his family were involved before I came to Staten Island in 2000. And there backstage, opening and closing the curtains, was Doris Gillis. She loved to smile and encourage nervous singers, (me included). To get jitters out of me, we danced the "Jitter Bug" to the music onstage. Also, if you ever showed up to donate blood for the New York Blood Bank, there she was giving hugs and welcoming and thanking everyone who came. One time, during a Blood Drive at Holy Child, I distinctly remember the roof in the gym was leaking water badly. It was dripping incessantly, so Doris, put out an inflatable baby wading pool catch the drops. I was getting more agitated as I was giving blood, and when Doris recognized that she came over to me and I couldn't get angry seeing her smiling face and hearing say. "It'll be alright". Oh the joys of being a pastor! Leaks, Lochs and Leases, the jewels in our crown of glory! May Doris, Terry, Mary and all who cross over into eternal life be blessed with His glory forever. It's been a joy serving you.
