#### St. Daniel the Stylite, Priest - December 11

Daniel was born in Syria in 409 and became a monk near the upper Euphrates. At age 42, he decided he wanted to live like St. Simeon Stylites on top of a pillar. Therefore, Emperor Leo I built a series of pillars with a platform on the top and Daniel was ordained there by St. Gennadus. St. Daniel celebrated mass on his pillar, preached sermons, dispensed spiritual advice and cured the sick who were brought up to him. He counseled Emperors Leo & Zeno and the Patriarch of Constantinople. While he lived pillar spirituality, he came down from his perch only once in 33 years – to turn Emperor Baliscus away from backing the heresy of Monophysitism. St. Daniel died in 493. ## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

#### Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to our 2nd Sunday of Advent. This week we light our Second Advent wreath candle and the evening before 150 Memorialized Christmas Trees were blessed and also lit. Jesus is the light of the world and His birth scattered the darkness of sin.

By now, you may have noticed the giving tree in the vestibule of the church and you are most welcome to take a tag and purchase a gift item for someone less fortunate. I would like to highlight a few of the upcoming events that will help us prepare for Christ's inbreaking into our hearts. We will be hosting an Interfaith Friendship Dinner in the O'Mara Hall on Sunday evening at 5PM with the Council of Churches and Interfaith communities here in Staten Island. You may recall we had about forty people attend an "honest conversation about race relations" back on October 4th. It was a very successful meeting and we wanted to draw on the strength of that good spirit and invite people to come and just sit at table with each other and share a meal. There will be a guided conversation following the meal and we will once again host our brothers and sisters from various churches and synagogues and mosques here on Staten Island.

Then during the week on Friday, December 11th at 8 PM, children from our Religious Education program will lead us in our annual Advent Lessons and Carols. It is always wonderful for us to hear the story of how our Savior came to be born in Bethlehem. Please come and join in the Christmas caroling. The children are precious.

The day after Thanksgiving, I had the wonderful pleasure of traveling into the area near Lancaster PA, to the Sight and Sound Theatre for their production of the "Miracle of Christmas." The music was awesome and the cast was amazingly talented and also the use of live animals in their panoramic scenes was impressive. The theater must have been the size of Radio City Music Hall and busloads of people gathered from all over the country. What struck me was the development of the theme of the oppressive times that Jesus was born into, with Rome occupying Israel and exacting hard labor and taxes upon them. Most interesting was the scene of the betrothal ceremony of Joseph and Mary, and the portraval of how much they loved each other. When Joseph heard from Mary that she was with child, the hurt, anguish, and agony of Joseph was dramatically portraved. Even Mary was deeply disturbed by the people's reaction to her pregnancy. It became apparent that she could have easily been stoned to death for such a sin. But she found hope and trust in the Lord. What was beautifully illustrated was the joy of Jesus' birth although in a cold stable setting. The music and acting was delightful.

This week, Father David Rider returns to Rome. He has requested a week off in order to attend the 1st vows and final vows of the Missionaries of Charity, the order of sisters founded by Mother Teresa of Calcutta. He will enjoy being reacquainted with the sisters who were his students, since he taught them Church History, this time last year. He will also enjoy many reunions with friends he made over the last 5 years. Father David will be in Rome for the beginning of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, beginning on December 8th. He is truly a missionary of mercy to us as he grows in deeper love and joy of celebrating the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Voyces for Christmas" is a chorale of acapella trained voices singing Christmas madrigals from the Middle Ages and recent times. They will be singing on December 13th at 5PM on our Church. This will definitely be a moving experience.

Advent Reconciliation Monday will take place from 4:00 to 8:00PM. All four priests will be in the church during this time to hear confessions and get our souls spruced up for Christmas. Please come and be set free from your sins.

On Thursday evening, December 17th at 7:30PM Father David will lead the parish in an Advent Forgiveness Liturgy. He will be preaching on the 15 reasons why people don't forgive and lead us in a special prayer service to be healed from all un-forgiveness. It promises to be a powerful evening. If at all possible clear your calendar and join us.

Advent is not only a time when Christ comes to us but more important when we intensify our prayerful stance and we come before Him. May you encounter His light and love.
