A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

As we begin to wind down our Christmas Season, I received in the mail an old classic, "Life of Christ" by Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen. I must admit I never read it, and when Father David Rider mentioned how the Missionaries of Charity pondered the hidden treasures of this classic throughout Lent, I began my search on Amazon.com and found it. I would like to share with you some quotes from the jacket cover.

> "It was not so much that His birth cast a shadow on His life, and led to His death; It was rather that the Cross was there from the beginning, and it cast its shadow backwards to his birth."

"Much more than a simple retelling of the familiar incidents of Christ's life, Bishop Sheen's long awaited Life of Christ is a dramatic and moving account of His significance as the God-Man, as a teacher, and in particular as the Savior of the world. Written with compassion and brilliant scholarship, it is without doubt Bishop Sheen's greatest work, the result of over twenty five years of dedicated research."

"The manger and the Cross thus stand at the two extremities of the Savior's life. He accepted the manger because there was no room in the inn; He accepted the Cross because men said, 'We will not have this Man for our King.' Disowned upon entering, rejected upon leaving, He was laid in a strangers stable at the beginning, and a stranger's grave at the end. As ox and ass surrounded His crib at Bethlehem; two thieves were to surround His cross on Calvary. He was wrapped in swaddling clothes in His birthplace, and He was again laid in swaddling clothes in His tomb..."

If you get the chance, join with me in discovering Jesus during this extraordinary year of Jubilee, through the heart and mind of Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen in his book "Life of Christ".

I am planning a mission trip to Kingston, Jamaica to visit the Missionaries of the Poor Brothers who were founded by Father Richard Ho Lung, MOP. This will occur right after Easter from April 6-11. We will leave at 9:30 AM on that Wednesday morning on JetBlue Flight 59 and return on the following Monday on JetBlue Flight 60 at 6:25PM. The cost is roughly \$550. The work of the mission is to labor at the mission centers feeding the poor and abandoned people within the community's 5 centers. You may Google "Missionaries of the Poor, Jamaica" and see what's involved. This will be my third trip and it was very moving encountering Christ in the poor. We enter into the prayer life of the Brothers, and this sustains their free service to the poorest of the poor. For further information contact me at the rectory.
