A MESSAGE FROM FR. TOM

Dear Parish Family,

We are well into our Lenten Journey and the Lord has called us to brave a very freezing winter with these temperatures. Spring is right around the corner and perhaps we need to overcome a little cabin fever and so it's a perfect time for a Parish Mission.

All throughout this week, we will be asking you to pray for the success of the Parish Mission, especially all you who are homebound, or infirm. I need for you to offer up your sufferings or tribulations for the success of this week of mission.

Last year, when I was assigned as an administrator of Our Lady of Pity Parish I had the joy of offering a parish mission with new and former members of the team and it was a huge success.

So what is a parish mission? It is a sacred time when the very basics of our Catholic Faith is presented in word, music, prayer and benediction in order to bring a revival in our faith life and draw us closer to Christ during this Lenten Season. The Parish Mission Team of the Archdiocese of New York existed from 1978 until 2001 and under the inspiration of the late Monsignor James Conlon, a community of priests, sisters, and laity lived together in Montebello section of Suffern, New York and each year they traveled to over 25 parishes and presented the Parish Mission. The team was introduced at all the Masses on the weekend prior and the themes of the mission were announced. During the week, there were visits to the homebound and after giving them Holy Communion and anointing of the sick, they were invited to pray for the success of the mission and they truly became for us, the powerhouse of the success of the mission.

The Parish Mission Team would then visit school and the religious education program and give a presentation on the themes of the mission to the children in ways they could understand with puppets, skits, music and prayers.

At the parish mission, there were prayer intentions cards that could be filled out and the team would gather before supper and pray these intentions along with Evening Prayer of the Church.

When the Parish Mission Team ended in June 2001, it was discovered that we had completed 770 parish missions, 70 members have lived the PMT community experience and we traveled to 7 pilgrimage sites. So biblically, it was 70 X 7, the formula Jesus gave us for forgiveness.

This week at Our Lady Star of the Sea Parish, we will offer this mission experience with some new and old members gathering for this faith filled week.

The Parish Mission Team will hold its mission on March 2,3,4 & 5 from 7:30-9 PM.

Monday's Theme: God's Love for us, Tuesday's Theme: Our Response to God's Love, Wednesday's Theme: (the heart of the Mission): Forgiveness and Reconciliation and Thursday's Theme: Unity and Healing. The mission concludes with the celebration of the Eucharist in which the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is administered.

The time for the mission is 7:30-8:00 prayer in word and music, followed by the mission hour.

The team includes Sister Maureen Colleary, FSP, who now works for Renew International, a former PMT member, Sister Jean Wagner, PBVM, who served more than 60 years on Staten Island as a teacher, Religious Education director and pastoral minister, Marie Ferro, DRE of Holy Child Parish, Grace Volpe, retired Art Teacher from Saint Joseph by the Sea High School, and art teacher at Saint Ann's School, Paul Zammit, history teacher at Saint Joseph by the Sea, and Frank De Martino, retired NYPD Captain and candidate for the permanent diaconate for Saint Clare's Parish, and Father Tom Devery, administrator of Our Lady Star of the Sea Church and former director of the Archdiocesan Parish Mission Team from 1990 -2000.

Through the gift of anointed preaching and sacred story- telling, lives get changed, hearts are touched and every participant wins the Lotto! The Spiritual Lotto! But like the regular lotto, you have to "Be in it to win it". Come to the Mission this week and experience the joy of the Gospel.

Hans and Sophie Scholl 1943 - Martyrs of the White Rose

In 1942, leaflets began appearing in Munich that contained sweeping indictments of the Nazi regime and enjoined readers to work for the defeat of their own nation - The Guestapo flew into a rage. This was the week of a few Christian students calling themselves the White Rose challenged Nazi tyranny. The center of it all were Hans (24) and Sophie (21), brother and sister. They waged spiritual war against the system - armed with courage, truth and an illegal duplicating machine. One leaflet stated, "At times of greatest trial, men have appeared, prophets and saints who cherished their freedom, who preached the One God and who, with His help, brought the people to a reversal of their downward course. We are your bad conscience." They were caught distributing leaflets in the university. Along with Christopher Probst (23) were convicted of treason and beheaded; they went calmly to their death believing that the executioners block was their entryway to Freedom and eternal life.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION RCIA Scrutiny

This Sunday, our RCIA Elect (Nicholas Tolan and Jonathan Lanning) will celebrate the 1st of 3 RCIA Scrutinies during the 10:30am mass. These Rites are intended to help deliver the Elect (those preparing for Baptism) from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. These Rites of Scrutiny are meant to uncover, and then to heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the Elects hearts and to bring out through repentance all that is upright, strong and good. These Scrutinies also remind the whole parish community of the need to reflect on their own sins and the need for God's help. We ask you to always keep our Elect and our Candidates in your prayers.

LENT 2015

Fast and Abstinence: Good Friday, April 3rd, is a day of fast and abstinence. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 19-59. The Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat from 14 years onward.

<u>Confessions</u>: Confessions are heard every Saturday from 3:30 to 4PM and from 5 to 5:30PM in the Church. The last confessions before Easter will be on Good Friday, April 3rd, from 12 Noon to 2:30PM. * (Reconciliation Monday: March 9th, from 3PM to 9PM, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available continuously in our Church.)
