St. Edmund Campion, Jesuit Martyr, 1581 - October 25

Edmund was a brilliant scholar and orator at Oxford. In 1569 he was ordained a deacon in the Anglican Church. He was later convinced that he should become a Catholic, even though this would entail professional ruin and even death. He went to France reconciled with the Catholic Church, and in 1578 was ordained a Jesuit in Rome. Returning to England, he eluded capture with disguises and hiding places. Edmund soon became England's most famous and most wanted Catholic. He was arrested, the first four days of his arrest he spent in a terrible cell that had been nicknamed, "Little Ease," because it was impossible to either stand erect or to lie down. Queen Elizabeth offered him a pardon if he would return to Protestantism. Edmund told her he recognized her temporal authority, but not her religious authority. He was tortured on the rack, unable to stand or lift his arms to his defense. He was executed in 1581 by being hung, drawn, and quartered. (JM)

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

I want to thank Bishop John O' Hara for Wednesday and Thursday; he confirmed our 8th grade students in religious education and in our school in the Sacrament of Confirmation. They are now fully initiated into the life of the Church and as Bishop O' Hara reminded us in his homily, we need to be plugged in and recharged in Christ all the time.

Concretely this means that we need to pray daily, and attend the holy sacrifice of the Mass either on Saturday evening or Sunday. Unless sickness or being at sea where there is no Mass available can one make the excuse to not go to church. The Third commandment requires us to "Keep holy the Sabbath", and this means that we are gather each Sunday to hear God's word and receive Him in Holy Communion. Thank you for your faithfulness in this matter and if you need to repent of this mortal sin, we priests are always available for confession.

Next week I will be joining the pastors of the Archdiocese of New York for our annual Pastors Conference in Spring Lake. This will be the first time we have all met since the "Making All Things New" program has initiated the merging of several parishes this past August. It should be an engaging time, a refreshing time and a time filled with fraternity and renewal. This begins on Monday afternoon and ends after lunch on Friday.

When I was a chaplain at West Point, one day I spotted a poster on the door of the Protestant Chaplain's Office; it read, "We need to retreat in order to advance." It seemed like an oxymoron but actually when I reflected, this statement is true. Now that summer is over and fall is in the air, we are all back to full swing of work or school. Midterms have ended and many of us are busy, engaged in full calendars of activity. However as we see the leaves falling off the trees and their magnificent colors amaze us, and as we experience a blast of cold chill, we are reminded from nature that there's a dying going on in creation all around us. Winter is coming and we need to ask ourselves the question: Where am I going in life? Am I closer or farther away from God? Am I restless or content, happy or sad, energized or drained, and as I get older am I ready to meet God at the end of this life journey? Take time to pray, reflect and invite Jesus to fill you with mercy, wisdom, peace and if need be healing and reconciliation. Last Monday evening, when Sister Jean Wagner was talking to the parents of our second grade students about the Sacrament of Reconciliation, she said, "Reconciliation comes from the Latin word 'Cilia" which means "eyelash". When we are fully reconciled we can face each other eyelash to eyelash without fear or regret. As we advance let us retreat into the mercy of God and experience His call to conversion.

Another great place for conversion is the desert. Carlo Carreto once wrote,

"Come into the Desert! If you can't go into the desert, be assured that the desert will come to you. In this sense, the desert is not a location. It is a spiritual experience meant to bring purification from sin, intimacy with God and enlightenment by the Holy Spirit. The desert takes us away from the ordinary rhythms of life so that we can examine ourselves. Its hardships and difficulties challenge us to look deep into our soul so that we can ask how deeply we are willing to trust God. Temptations to grumble against God move us to seek His strength and encouragement lest we fall. Alone in the desert we are brought face to face with one central question: "Am I living the way God wants me to live? What does this mean practically?" While each person is different, there are a couple of approaches we can all consider: Try cutting yourself away from the onslaught of images and information that the media offers you every day. Take a step back from television, smart phones, I-pads and the internet. Try to deprive yourselves of some of the comforts and luxuries of life; good food, unnecessary purchases, and fun times. In place of these, discern how you can embrace the challenges, lowliness, and neediness that are at the heart of the life in the desert. God will work. We can be like Jesus, keeping our eyes fixed on our heavenly Father and try to listen to Him. Every story in Sacred Scripture – and in every saint since the beginning of the Church – tells us that if we give up some of the comforts and self- sufficiency while we are in the desert, we will be blessed far beyond what we can hope or imagine. We will see victories we once thought were impossible!"
