STAR OF THE SEA

Hail Star of the Sea / God's own gentle Mother / and ever holy Virgin / blessed gate of heaven / Keep our life all spotless / make our way secure / till we find in Jesus, you forevermore

As we near the peak of the Atlantic hurricane season, we become more and more aware of the dangers of a wind-roused ocean. As long ago as the ninth century, the seas that ravaged the European coast inspired the hymn, <u>Ave Maris Stella</u>. The same images appear in the eleventh century hymn, <u>Alma Redemptoris Mater</u>, still sung at night prayer at some seasons. Both hymns give way to an extended prayer for deliverance from sin and evil through Mary's intercession, but they make no further mention of the sea. However, at some point, mariners, well used to navigating the stars, picked up the title and adopted Mary, Star of the Sea, as their patron and protector. She remains so down to our day.

The rest of us, safely traveling terra firma on our daily round, might not seem to need the help of such a patron and protector – unless we recognize the perilous sea that laps at every day's doorstep. A wise friend alerted me to it with a warning, "Beware of drowning in the sea of possibilities."

And we can. Consider the invitation flashing on our digital devices; sign up for an online Shakespeare course, download delicious recipes to tickle the taste buds of family or friends, take a virtual tour of Notre Dame Cathedral, discover the exercise program that you need, or, or course, shop for anything you need at all. Consider the parish bulletin: bible studies, the food pantry needs volunteers, sign up for adoration day or night. And that's just a small sample, without even looking at the to do list, the notes on the refrigerator door, the reminders on your phone. Having too many choices is not confined to the electronically savvy or the financially secure. Think of the difficult and painful decision facing those in nursing homes, on the street, in poor neighborhoods.

Options are always and everywhere on offer, demanding attention and decision. As the options accumulate, they paralyze. Worse, the recurring possibilities harden into imperatives, growing icebergs in the sea of possibilities. The books you could read become the books you must read, the programs you could sign up for become the programs you have to sign up for; the meetings you could go to become the meetings you must at all costs fit in. Drowning is a real possibility.

What to do? Listen to the mariners. Take your eyes off your wet feet. Look up. Call on Mary, shining steadfastly to guide us. Her light, a faithful reflection of the Light of the World, illumines priorities and dangers, highlights what is true to us and our lives versus what comes from someone else's must-have, or must-do list, spotlights the icebergs before they can drag us all down. The <u>Ave Maris Stella</u> goes on to call her the gate of heaven, the gate through which Christ's light shines on our storm-battered path and guides us home.
