A Letter from the Pastor

Dear Parish Family,

Happy Season of Autumn! We bid farewell to the hot weather of the summer and we welcome the cooler temperatures and bright colors of this season. Although this can be a colorful and bright season I am mindful of the devastation occurring these days in our Southern states with the rapid succession of hurricanes and the dangerous conditions accompanying the West coast fires. This past weekend there was a reprieve there with much needed rainfall. However, the quality of air is terrible given the traveling smoke. My sister who lives in outskirts of Las Vegas was sharing with me that they too can smell the smoke from the LA fires. It has been over 155 days since rain fell. So, we need to beg the Lord for relieve from these climatic tragedies there.

With the turning of the colors of the trees and the leaves beginning to fall, I am reminded of the Paschal Mystery. Falling leaves doesn't mean falling virtues. We take hope in Christ being with us in every season. The seasons of life indicate and pattern of dying and rising. Just as we have become aware of the need for protection from the coronavirus epidemic and that fact that 200,000 Americans have died from this dreaded disease, on the other hand there is still new life as we see so many babies coming forth for baptism. I recall seeing crochet needle work on a pillow in a baby's crib, "A baby is God's opinion that the world will go on." We are praying this season for the children who have returned to classes and the stress on teachers and parents to remain healthy as we embrace the colder temperatures. The other day I went to the CVS on Seguire Avenue for my free flu shot. I usually get it at the Pastor's conference in Spring Lake in mid -October, however thanks to the pandemic, it has been cancelled and the speakers will give their presentation virtually to us on Zoom. When I spoke to the pharmacist she offered to come to our school and give the faculty the regular flu shot on either a Thursday or Friday. I thanked her and said when we find an opportune time; we will get in touch with her to avail ourselves of this offer.

Bishop John O' Hara will be administering the Sacrament of Confirmation to our 8th grade students on October 11th at 12:30 and October 13th and October 15th at 4PM for our children in the religious education program and then return on November 10 and November 12 at 4PM to confirm the children from our school. Between now and then may I remind these candidates and their sponsors of the opportunity to avail themselves for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Every Saturday from 3:30 to 5PM sacramental confessions are available. Grace builds on nature, and we can prepare will for the power and authority of the Holy Spirit if we examine our conscience and see where we all need to repent. We all fall short of the glory of God when we sin. As a fellow sinner I know the wonder of being forgiven and being open to receive all the Christ invites us. A great prayer to pray is "Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. Enkindle in us the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and we shall be created; and you shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who did instruct the hearts of your faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit. Grant in us that same Spirit to be truly wise and ever rejoice in your consolation through Christ our Lord. AMEN."

PLEASE NOTE: Registration forms MUST be turned in to the Rectory prior to attending the Baptismal Class. Dates for Baptisms are not guaranteed until the required documents are turned into the Rectory and the date is confirmed by rectory staff.

Sponsor Certificates

Certificates attesting to the fact that an OLSS parishioner is a practicing Catholic are often required when they are asked to sponsor someone at the time of Baptism or Confirmation. These certificates may be obtained **AFTER** the Masses on Saturday evening or Sunday. The **PERSON REQUIRING THE CERTIFICATE MUST** see the priest **AFTER ATTENDING THE MASS** to request one. **Due to COVID-19, registered parishioners can receive a sponsor certificate from the Rectory, Mon-Fri from 10AM-4PM.
