Effective Sunday, November 1st, we will resume our regular Mass schedule with Masses at 8am, 9:30, 11, 12:30, and 7pm and 4pm on Saturday. The 5:30 Mass will resume on November 7th. Social distancing and face coverings are mandatory.

A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

We are coming down to the wire with the election of the President of the United States. Whether it be early voting, absentee ballot or voting on election day, get out and vote. This is a very- important time in the history of our country; and we will keep praying to God for the future of our nation. May it be a time of peace and healing.

On November 2nd and 3rd the parishes of Saint Charles and Our Lady of Pity will be hosting an all night vigil of prayer beginning at 7PM Mass. Bishop John O'Hara will be offering Mass at Saint Charles Church in Oakwood and Bishop Peter Byrne will be offering Mass at Our Lady of Pity Church in Bullshead. The exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be held all night until 5AM Mass the following morning. All are invited to pray.

Also, there is another 40 days of prayer and fasting being offered for Pro Life. Participants can either stand in front of Staten Island University Hospital North on Seaview Avenue and pray in silence or you may pray at home. From 7AM to 7pm all parishes are invited to participate.

At the end of this upcoming week is the Halloween celebration. This is always held on the day before the Feast of All Saints, or All Hallows. Normally this would be a major event in our Church Parking lot with "Trunk or Treat". However due to the pandemic this has been cancelled. Although we are not scheduling any Halloween events, we strongly encourage parents to carefully monitor the local situation with parties or trick or treating with their children. It's imperative and mandatory that we protect one another from another spike in the virus. Given the situation of the past two weeks with a slight increase in positivity rate on the south shore of Staten Island, please be mindful, wise and precautious: wear masks, frequent hand washings and not gathering in large groups, especially indoors. It will save lives! Watching the news on television the CDC has recommended that Thanksgiving, our greatest holiday for gathering family, we should stay small in number. I am praying everyday for the creation of the antivirus serum which will bring an end to this difficult time.

When Bishop O'Hara came to us for the Sacrament of Confirmation two weeks ago; he mentioned that there will be an indult come Christmas Eve to be able to offer more Masses for the Christmas Season beginning with 2PM. We haven't finalized the Christmas Schedule but given the demand and the 30% capacity mandate, it is possible to offer Mass on Christmas Eve at 2PM – 3:30PM - 5PM - 10:30PM and Midnight and on Christmas Day at 7:30AM – 9AM- 10:30AM – 12 Noon- 1:30PM. Christmas Eve occurs on a Friday and Saturday in Christmas Day. There will be no 4PM or 5:30PM on Christmas Day and Sunday Schedule will be 8AM –9:30AM – 11 AM – 12:30 PM and 7PM. We will keep you posted if there is any further changes.

In today's reading at Mass there is an important point of view from our reading from Exodus 22:20-26. Biblical laws present life from God's point of view. Laws and commandments have the purpose to reprogram humans and persuade them to live according to divine standards. In our reading today it is especially important to the God of Israel to notice the way people treat each other. It forbids molesting or oppressing one's neighbor or even bullying foreigners. It also highlights the most vulnerable people such as widows and orphans and the frail and elderly. We are being held accountable to God for the way we care and treat each other. Jesus will go on to remind us that if we Love God with our whole mind, heart, soul and strength and love our neighbor as ourselves then we fulfill all the commandments and live according to God's purposes for us.
