A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Here's a little Christmas Story entitled "God, Geese and Christmas"

There once was a man who didn't believe in God. His wife, a believer, raised their children in faith despite her husband's critical comments. One snowy Christmas Eve, the wife was taking their children to church in the farm community in which they lived. She asked her husband to come with them, but he refused. "That Story is nonsense!" he said. "Why would God lower Himself to become a man? That's ridiculous!" So, she and the children left; and he stayed home.

In the meantime, the winds grew stronger and the snow turned into a blizzard. As the man sat down to relax before the fire for the evening, he heard a loud thump. Something had hit the window. Then another thump. He looked out in the field near his house where he saw a flock of wild geese caught in the snowstorm. They were lost and stranded on his farm with no food or shelter. They just flopped their wings and blindly flew around in circles. A couple of them had flown into his window. The man felt sorry for the geese and wanted to help them. He thought that his barn would be a great place for them to stay. So, he opened the barn's door, hoping that the geese would notice it and go inside. But the geese just fluttered around aimlessly and didn't realize what was expected of them.

The man tried to get their attention, but that seemed to scare them, and they moved further away. He took some bread and a bread crumb trail leading to the barn. They still didn't catch on. Now he was getting frustrated. He got behind them and tried to shoo them toward the barn toward the barn, but they got more scared and scattered in every direction but the barn. Nothing he did could get them to go into the barn where they would be warm and safe. "Why don't they follow me", he exclaimed. "Can't they see this is the only place where they could survive the storm?" He realized they would not follow a human. "If only I were a goose, then I could save them", he said out loud. He decided to release one of his own geese out of the barn. His goose flew through the flock and straight into the barn, and one by one the other geese followed it to safety.

He stood silently for a moment as the words he had spoken a few minutes earlier replayed in his mind. "If only I were a goose, then I could save them!" Then the thought about what he had said to his wife earlier. "Why would God want to lower himself to be like us? Suddenly it all made sense. That is what God had done. We were like the geese – blind, lost and perishing. God sent His Son to become like us so He could enlighten us and show us the way.

Some of the most powerful stirring words we will ever hear this Christmas comes from the angels singing in Bethlehem. "For unto us is born this day, in the city of David, a Savior who is Christ and Lord. You will find an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger."

There were many caves with lambs at that time but the one cave that had swaddling clothes was the precise spot where the shepherd would find Jesus. You see a newborn lamb, without spot or wrinkle or blemish would be removed from the rest of the herd and wrapped in swaddling clothes so as to be preserved for the ritual sacrifices of the Temple especially at Passover. Jesus was born for us and the Lamb of God, who go from the manger of wood to the wood of the Cross and be born for us and die for us to set us free from sin, suffering and death. Let us remember why Christ was born. He came to ransom us from our sins. "O Come Let us adore Him". Merry Christmas and a blessed season of Christmas to you and all your loved ones.

OLSS Baptism Preparation Policy

All parish families preparing for the Baptism of their child must attend the OLSS Baptismal Class. Please contact the Rectory Mon-Fri 10-4 to obtain a Baptism Registration Packet. **Baptismal Ceremonies occur every Sunday at 2 PM** **Baptismal Class Dates for Parents will occur every other Sunday at 1 PM via Zoom.** Please contact the rectory for class information. *PLEASE NOTE: Registration forms MUST be turned in to the Rectory prior to attending the Baptismal Class. Dates for Baptisms are not guaranteed until the required documents are turned into the Rectory and the date is confirmed by rectory staff.*

Sponsor Certificates

Certificates attesting to the fact that an OLSS parishioner is a practicing Catholic are often required when they are asked to sponsor someone at the time of Baptism or Confirmation. THIS WEEK'S READINGS AND RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

1st Reading:

God sets a father in honor over his children; a mother's authority he confirms over her sons. Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and preserves himself from them. When he prays, he is heard; he stores up riches who reveres his mother. Whoever honors his father is gladdened by children, and, when he prays, is heard. Whoever reveres his father will live a long life; he who obeys his father brings comfort to his mother.

My son, take care of your father when he is old; grieve him not as long as he lives. Even if his mind fail, be considerate of him; revile him not all the days of his life; kindness to a father will not be forgotten, firmly planted against the debt of your sins—a house raised in justice to you.

Brothers and sisters: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another, if one has a grievance against another as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do. And over all these put on love, that is, the bond of perfection. And let the peace of Christ control your hearts, the peace into which you were also called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or in deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Wives, be subordinate to your husbands, as is proper in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives, and avoid any bitterness toward them.

Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord. Fathers, do not provoke your children, so they may not become discouraged.

THIS WEEK'S GOSPEL

The Gospel

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord,

Every male that opens that womb shall be consecrated to the Lord,

and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons,

in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

“Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel.”

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, “Behold this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted—and you yourself a sword will pierce—so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.”

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshipped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth.

The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.
