A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

During this season of Advent as we prepare for Christmas. We admit we need a Savior. Jesus came to save us from our sins. Jesus imparts to us grace. This is God's free gift of Himself into our lives, our way of living, thinking and behaving.

There is a Lutheran minister who lived and died in 1943 Germany, named Dietrich Bonhoffer. He was a pastor, theologian, martyr and spy. He was once asked how is it possible for the Church to sit back and let Hitler seize absolute power. His firm answer: "It was the teaching of cheap grace." "Cheap grace is the forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline, communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ.- Dietrich Bonhoffer. Today we live in a time and culture that not only teaches cheap grace but praises it.

Beware of cheap grace. You are required to pay for food, clothing, and shelter here on earth. Likewise, do not be fooled into believing that "Getting into Heaven" is a free ride. Jesus paid the ultimate price and reduced your cost of salvation; but it is not cheap, and it may be free but it still requires hard and diligent work. That work is your gift and proof that you believe in the sanctifying grace of God.

An image that came out of a Zoom Bible Study last weekend was the fact that many of us seem to blow through Advent and not do the inner work of conversion and examination of conscience to determine, how and why I need a savior. Just what is my sin these days. It's not necessarily the sins of commission, but the sin of omission. What do I fail to do? Why do I need God's grace to reorientate my life so that I am not lost?

Taking the time to be alone and silent with God each day and enter into a quiet time of prayer, just listen, don't speak, don't read, just come before the Lord. He will lead.

In another prayer resourse, "Jesus Calling", Sara Young's reflection for November 30th is inspirational. *Problems are part of life.* They are inescapable, woven into the very fabric of a fallen world. You tend to go into problem solving all too readily, acting as if you have the capacity to fix everything. This is a habitual response, so automatic that it bypasses your conscious thinking. Not only does this habit frustrate you, it also distances you from Me.

Do not let fixing things be your top priority. You are ever so limited in your capacity to correct all that is wrong in the world around you. Don't weight yourself down with responsibilities that are not your own. Instead, make your relationship with Me your primary concern. Talk with Me about whatever is on your mind, seeking my perspective on the situation. Rather than trying to fix everything that comes to your attention, ask Me to show you what is truly important. Remember that you are en route to heaven, and let your problems face in the light of Eternity.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once said, "So the divine love is a sacrificial love. Love does not mean to have to own and to possess. It means to be had and to be owned and to be possessed. It is not a circle circumscribed by self; it is arms outstretched to embrace all humanity within its grasp. No other love is ever going to be a satisfying love. All that we ever get in this world anyway is just a fragment, a fraction of love. We can catch a spark; it is caught up from the great white flame of love which is God. That's all we ever get. And if, to remind us of another love, the spark is so bright, then what must be the flame? It is the cross; it's self- denial, it's victimhood, for this is the gospel of Christ, and we cannot soften him. He is the one who gave his life and that's the way he measures his love. Greater love than this no man has. When we stay close to that love, day and day, hour after hour, others begin to feel that love."

At the 11AM Mass this Sunday Father Basil Akut will celebrate his silver Jubilee, 25 years ago on December 9th, he became a priest. He has survived so much and continues to tell us through it all. God is good, all the time and all the time, God is good. Please remember him in your prayers. Thank you, Father Basil!

I hope these reflections will fire up your soul this Advent. God bless,

Dates for Baptisms are not guaranteed until the required documents are turned into the Rectory and the date is confirmed by rectory staff.

THIS WEEK'S READINGS AND RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

1st Reading:

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the Lord double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the Lord! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plain, the rough country, a broad valley. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken. Go up onto a high mountain, Zion, herald of glad tidings; cry out at the top of your voice, Jerusalem, herald of good news! Fear not to cry out and say to the cities of Judah: Here is your God!

Therefore, beloved, since you await these things, be eager to be found without spot or blemish before him, at peace.
