A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

I would like to share with you some practical aspects of the preparations we are making for Ash Wednesday and the Lenten season and Palm Sunday. Since we are coping with safety during this pandemic this is what we have decided to do as a best practice. For Ash Wednesday: Ashes will be placed in a small envelop and they will be blessed during the Mass or the Service for Ashes and will be distributed one to each person. You can trace the sign of the cross with these ashes on your own forehead. There was another practice that is offered from what is done in Rome, the sprinkling of the ashes on the top of head. However, in America people would not accept this.

On February 17th Ash Wednesday, 2021 the Church will remind us that the season of Lent is a time for fasting, prayer and works of charity to deepen and intensify our relationship with Jesus and encourage people to come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We encounter Jesus most powerfully in sacramental confessions and experience His merciful love. Not counting Sunday's in Lent, for 40 days we will make a spiritual journey through the desert of these difficult times. For many of us, we are grieving the unexpected loss of a loved one or the loss of good health as we personally struggle with quarantine and isolation after having contracted the Covid-19 virus. For some of us, the loss of jobs, especially those in the restaurant or entertainment industry has been a source of anxiety and stress. Having been unable to see loved ones who are elderly, whether at home, or in nursing homes or in the hospital have brought great grief and sacrifice. Thank God for Zoom sessions where we can at least gather and have an avenue for communication with dear ones. It will be one year of tremendous sacrifice as we await the opportunity to get the vaccinations and hopefully achieve herd immunity.

We are also foregoing palm branches this year. Instead, we will be blessing the palms of your hands, on Palm Sunday. It is too risky to be handing out palm branches and the possibility of spreading the virus looms large. When we bless the palms of your hands, we will recall the many ways we have reached out our palms, our hands in loving service to one another this Lenten Season. Maybe you drove someone to the doctors, or you shopped for someone unable to leave home. Perhaps you cooked a meal or made a dessert for a neighbor or family member; in all these gestures you used your hands. The essence of our Lenten Sacrifices is fulfilling the primary commandment of Jesus. "Love the Lord your God, with your whole heart, your whole soul, your whole mind and with your whole strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself".

Palm Sunday is also called Passion Sunday, since we will enter into Holy Week and recall what great love Jesus had for us in washing the disciple's feet, his torturous agony in the Garden and his whipping and scourging that lead Him to embrace the cross. Jesus carried His Cross and ours all the way to Calvary.

I always found it interesting that when it came time to nail Jesus to the cross, the Romans pierced His hands and feet. These were the same hands that touched lepers, the blind, the lame, the crippled and deaf. The adversaries of Jesus thought they could prevent Jesus from ever reaching out and healing us. They also similarly nailed His feet, so he could no longer travel to spread the Gospel. But after the Resurrection until now, Christ uses our hands and feet to continue His saving work of healing, teaching and redeeming us. We are His hands and His feet today. So we need to be reminded of that when we have our hands Palms, blessed this Palm Sunday.

So we prepare during this Ordinary Time for Christ to become the center of our lives and save us out of this pandemic, let us pray and entrust ourselves to Him more completely.

All parish families preparing for the Baptism of their child must attend the OLSS Baptismal Class. Please contact the Rectory Mon-Fri 10-4 to obtain a Baptism Registration Packet. **Baptismal Ceremonies occur every Sunday at 2 PM** **Baptismal Class Dates for Parents will occur every other Sunday at 12 NOON via Zoom.** Please contact the rectory for class information. *PLEASE NOTE: Registration forms MUST be turned in to the Rectory prior to attending the Baptismal Class. Dates for Baptisms are not guaranteed until the required documents are turned into the Rectory and the date is confirmed by rectory staff.*
