A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Welcome to the Holy Season Lent. This is our Spiritual Spring Training season. We go back to the basics of our Catholic faith and prepare for Easter Sunday when we will renew our Baptismal Promises and rise with the Risen Christ. Traditionally, Lent was seen as a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Very often the question would be asked of one another, "So, what are you giving up for Lent?" It would be in the past, wine, beer, chocolate, desserts, going to the movies and such. Perhaps a better question would be: "What are you giving over for Lent?" I recall one Lenten season, I had asked a brother priest about his fasting plan for Lent and he said "Facebook", another had a more humorous response, "Complaining".

Matthew Kelly, wrote a wonderful 111 page book called "I heard God laugh". He makes many great points about prayer. Did anyone every really teach you how to pray? Where are you in your relationship with God? Busy is not your friend. This challenging read, very simple and profound touches on many ways we can learn to develop our prayer life. Usually, when we Catholics speak about prayer life, with immediately think of the Our Father, the Hail Mary, the Rosary or the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. All these prayers are wonderful, yet the author was taught one day how to pray and converse with Jesus rather than reciting memorized prayers and that made a great difference in developing his relationship with Christ. Here is a prayer process he recommends.

- 1. Gratitude: Begin with thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for today
- 2. Awareness: Revisit the times in the past 24 hours when you were and were not the best version of yourself. Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.
- 3. Significant Moments: Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).
- 4. Peace: Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed (against yourself, another person, or Him) and to fill you with a deep and abiding peace.
- 5. Freedom: Speak with God about how he is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the freedom to be the best version of yourself.
- 6. Others: Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.
- 7. Finish: by praying the Our Father

Lent is an invitation to pray a Prayer of Surrender, here is one mentioned by Matthew Kelly, again in his work "I heard God laughing"

Lord, Here I am. I trust that you have an incredible plan for me. Today, I surrender my whole being to your care. I surrender my life, my plans, and my very self to you. I make myself 100 per cent available to you today. Transform me, Transform my life. Everything is on the table. Take what you want to take and give what you want to give. Transform me into the person you created me to be, so I can live the life you envisioned for me at the beginning of time.

I hold nothing back. I am 100 per cent available. Lead me, challenge me, encourage me, and open my eyes to all your amazing possibilities. Show me what it is you want me to do, and I will do it. Amen.

Very often we seem to be telling God what we want Him to do, let's ask the question this Lent, what do you want me to do. If we listen and pray, He'll speak. A blessed Lent to all of you.

Fast & Abstinence: The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 19-59. The Fridays in Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat from 14 years onward.

<u>Confession</u>: The Sacrament of Reconciliation is held EVERY Saturday from 3:30 to 5:30 PM.

Stations of the Cross: Stations are held every Friday at 8 PM during Lent.


Unite your daily rosary to the prayers of the Legion of Mary



READINGS AND RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Second Reading

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, that righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.
