A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

On this third Sunday of Lent we will listen to the recitation of the 10 Commandments. This is also known as the Covenant Code. Israel has left Egypt. They are no longer slaves. There are still wandering in the desert and Moses was given this code of behaviors to honor God by the proper functioning of the new community of faith, as they gradually adjust to life outside of Egypt. The modern take of this is to listen seriously to God's sacred word and to take it to heart. These are 10 commandments, not 10 suggestions. In our covenant relationship with God, if we want blessings in this life; we need to root out of our sinful behaviors. That is why Lent is a season of repentance.

Israel found itself amid many different religious groups, who each had multiple god's, all who need to be appeased. The Lord has made clear to Israel that there is only one God. The question for us today is Are we faithful to our God and to His commandments? Obviously not all the time but let's defrag our brains from the false idols that try and take up space in our lives and behaviors. Life, it seems, is lived on a continuum of Grace at one end, and Addiction at the other end. We are caught somewhere in the middle and being honest with ourselves and being humble and vulnerable before God. We begin each Lent starting with ashes. These ashes represent the garbage in our lives that we need to let go. It's not a mark of showing our family and neighbors, "See I am a Catholic", the rest of the 364 days of the year will give evidence of we are really living our faith or just pretending.

When I was a child there was in the early days of television a show hosted by Art Linkletter called "Children say the strangest things". Art would have young children sitting on a stool, he would ask questions, and they would give simple and sometimes profound answers. One day he asked the question. "Can any of you name one of the 10 commandments?" One bright girl immediately raised her hand and said," I know, I know number 9. Art was amazed so he asked her, "Number 9?" "Yes, she said proudly, "Thou shalt not take to covers from your neighbor's wife" (LOL). Art Linkletter was shocked and admitted, "Well yes, that's when trouble begins".

We see in the second commandment an explanation of "Craven Images". The One true God doesn't want us to have false idols. All the pagan religions had their statues and totem poles and symbols for their many gods. But what are the false idols today in the 21st Century. Could it be that money, power, honor, fame, reputation becomes over emphasized "false Idols" if it contributes to an over inflated EGO. I love the acronym for EGO, we ease God out of our lives. The secular culture of today fosters "Me first attitude, "or "It's all about me being noticed." We do not understand the fact that you are not loved because you are beautiful, no, you are beautiful because you loved. That love being the sign of the Cross. See how far, and wide, and deep God's love is for you. If you were the only human creature made in His image and likeness that ever lived, God would have come down from heaven and died on that cross just so that he could redeem you in His grace. It really is "Amazing Grace".

Our responsorial Psalm underscores this well, "Lord, you have the words of everlasting life." Saint Paul in the First Letter to the Corinthians says to us clearly, that Jews demand signs and Greeks look for wisdom, but we proclaim Christ, crucified, a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to the Gentiles, but to those who are called Jew and Greek alike Christ, the power of God and wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength."

When Jesus and his apostles gathered at Cesarea Phiippi there were many caves that housed false idols, and so Our Blessed Lord, asks, "But you, who do say that I am?" And for once, Peter gets it right, "You are the Christ, the son of the living God".

In our Gospel text, Jesus overturns the money changers' tables and makes a whip of cords and expels them from the Temple. "My house should be a house of prayer." The righteous anger of Jesus and the zeal for His Father's house turned everything upside down, literally. We need that same zeal. Jesus predicts his own passion although the listeners didn't understand, but the Temple of His body would soon be destroyed and raised up.

As we turn from sin, repent, confessing and letting go Jesus fills us with "Resurrecting Hope". This is the words on the masks in Holy Spirit Parish in Las Vegas, my sister's parish. May the hope of new life: renewed, restored and redeemed be yours this Lenten Season.


<u>Confession:</u> The Sacrament of Reconciliation is held EVERY Saturday from 3:30 to 5:30 PM.

THE GOSPEL

Since the Passover of the Jews was near, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. He found in the temple area those who sold oxen, sheep, and doves, as well as the money changers seated there. He made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said. "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, Zeal for your house will consume me. At this the Jews answered and said to him, "What sign can you show us for doing this?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up."
