A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

As we saw April Showers giving us May flowers during this Easter Season, we long for the sunshine and warmer weather. The Risen Christ still reminds us that we are as Saint Augustine once said, "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song."

Venerable Fulton J. Sheen wrote a reflection on how Christ's death and resurrection remake us. *Our Lord is not primarily a teacher, he is a Savior. That's the meaning of the word 'Jesus', he will save us from our sins. Suppose we took a chalice as an example of what he did for us. Suppose the chalice was taken from the altar and made into a beer mug and delivered over into unholy ones, it's shape and contour completely changed. Then it was found. How could it ever be restored to the altar? Well first of all, we have to put it into a furnace, burn off the old shape and form, and hammer it again into the pattern of a chalice. Then we would bless it and restore it to the altar. That is what God did with human nature. He took this chalice of humanity, threw it into the fires of Calvary, where he was scourged and beaten. And then he was restored into a new shape on Easter and became the new creation. This is what he did with the pattern of human nature.*

Last week we heard the story of Doubting Thomas and Archbishop Sheen reflected on how Thomas knew it was the Lord.

Finally. Thomas saw the risen Lord. We are perhaps a little too critical because he doubted. But there was something commendable about this man., because Thomas was not going to surrender himself to any king but Christ. He could be proclaimed as a teacher; he could be proclaimed as a king; he would be a wonder worker, he could do anything. But that was the one kind of love that Thomas knew to be the test, and that was the love that was victimal, the love that went to death for another.

That is the way Mary Magdalen recognized Jesus too. "In the place where they crucified Him, there was a garden," says Saint John—a place where new life springs up. As Magdalen fell at his feet, through her tear dimmed eyes, she saw the two red marks of the nails and knew it was he. And when the Lord appeared to Thomas, he satisfied his demand for sacrificial love by saying, "Thomas, put your finger here into my hands and your hand into my side. And be not incredulous but believing. Thomas had the test, the test of a resurrected presence. Blessed are they who have not seen but believe.

I am so grateful to God for the Divine Mercy graces that were poured out upon us and as we face the days ahead, I am praying for good health for everyone and the gradual return of our parishioners to Mass. I know that we are still taking Covid precaution and we are taking a wait and see approach in the next few weeks. We will be having the 2nd graders receiving their First Holy Communion and we will be celebrating the ordination to the priesthood of Carmine Caruso. He was with us for Holy Week Triduum and last week he was working hard cranking out papers and getting ready for the final exams all before his big day May 29th. Carmine has not heard how many tickets he will have for Saint Patrick's Cathedral. Plans are being made for a bus to taken invited guests to the Cathedral. The Website for Saint Patrick's Cathedral will live stream his ordination along with 9 other men on Saturday May 29 at 8:30AM.

The next day, parishioners are invited to join us for his First Mass of Thanksgiving at 2PM here at Our Lady Star of the Sea Church. It is customary to receive his first priestly blessing. This will occur after his First Mass. Please keep him and his classmates in your prayers these days.

Alleluia! Jesus Christ is Risen from the dead, Alleluia!

Second Reading

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

THE GOSPEL

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of the bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them. "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

THIS WEEK'S MUSIC

Entrance: Three Days

1. Three days our world was broken; the Lord of life lay dead. "Take up your cross," he told us who followed where he led. Would we now hang in torment with thieves on every side, our Passover shattered, our hope crucified? Three days we hid in silence, in bitter fear and grief. Three days we clung together where he had washed our feet.

2. Three days and on the third day, the women came at dawn. His tomb, they said, was empty, his broken body gone. Who could believe their story? The dead do not arise, yet he walks among us, and with our own eyes we've seen him at this table; we've shared his bread and wine. Hearts burning bright within us, we've seen his glory shine.

3. Three days our world was broken and in an instant healed, God's covenant of mercy in mystery revealed. Two thousand years are one day in God's eternal sight, and yesterday's sorrows are this day's delight. Though still Christ's body suffers, pierced daily by the sword, yet death has no dominion: the risen Christ is Lord!

Preparation: Two Were Bound for Emmaus

1. Two were bound for Emmaus, disheartened and lost; all their hope for the future had been nailed to a cross. Love unknown then walked beside them, come back from the dead, and they knew he was risen in the breaking of bread.

2. On the Sea of Tiberius, when the night was nearly gone and their toil seemed so useless, not one fish had they caught, from the shore the stranger called to them: "Cast your net, friends, once more." And they filled it to bursting, but the net was not torn.

3. Then they knew it was Jesus and they hastened into shore; bread and fish for their breakfast from the hands of their Lord. "O Peter, if you love me you must care for my sheep; if you follow your Shepherd, then a shepherd you'll be."

Communion #1: We Walk by Faith

1. We walk by faith, and not by sight:

No gracious words we hear

Of him who spoke as none e'er spoke,

But we believe him near.

2. We may not touch his hands and side,

Nor follow where he trod;
