A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

A blessed Pentecost to you! Our Easter Season has concluded. Jesus said to the Apostles at the time of his Ascension, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon, and you will be my witnesses to the ends of the earth." This is the day when the Holy Spirit did enter like a mighty wind, and a ball of fire that enflamed their heads as tongues of flame. They were all gathered in the upper Room, the Cenacle, where Jesus had his Last Supper and for 10 days the apostles and the Blessed Mother had prayed and anticipated this stirring moment. When the disciples recount this experience the immediate reaction seems to be one of intense enthusiasm. All fear and anxiety left them. They were aware the presence of the Risen Christ wasn't just visibly before them but rather dwelt within them. He gave them bold confidence. So much so that the doors which were locked and barred were then immediately thrown open. Peter led this assembly straight to the temple gate and began to proclaim that Jesus is Lord. The common understanding of those gathered for the Passover was the Caesar was Lord. No, it was Jesus, who is the Son of God, who was tortured, crucified and risen from the dead now bids the hearers to repent of their sins, be baptized in the all-powerful name of Jesus and receive the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Father.

What happened next was almost as outstanding as the tongues of flames. All who heard Peter's speech were amazed that they understood exactly what he was saying in their own language. They had made the journey to Jerusalem from all over the Middle East. And as the Acts of the Apostles declares, some three thousand people became believers that day. Now that's power. Given all the confusion of the Tower of Babel in the Book of Genesis, just the opposite happened in Pentecost.

Do we need a new Pentecost, in this our time now! The divisions and fear and anxiety and depression of our pandemic times cry out for healing, understanding, boldness, and a community of belief in Jesus. Events in India, Palestine, Israel, our own inner cities, our own suburbs and in the lives of our young people so confused and disillusioned with today's economy, politics and uncertainty. We see the whole realm of secular thought and no moral compass, and subjectivism bringing back people down the rabbit hole of isolation and an inability to reach out and relate. Where do people turn for wisdom, understanding, guidance and bold confidence. If it's not in the Spirit of Jesus, we see what dominates their lives. Who is Lord of their lives? Is it power, wealth, honor, fame? If Christ is in the center of our lives, we know how to handle all the above if not, we become too self-absorbed, self-reverential, and this leads to all sorts of avenues for the evil one to dominate. Ask anyone who has dealt with addiction and felt powerless and trapped.

This Pentecost isn't just another Sunday where we wear Red Vestments, sing Holy Spirit songs and "Happy Birthday Church". No, it's a reliance on the victory of the Risen Christ over sin, suffering and death. Saint Paul after being knocked off his horse and undergoing a major conversion of life said later, "None of us lives as our own master and none of us dies as our own master. When we live, we live for the Lord, when we die we die as his servants."

I invite you to join us on June 6, 2021, the Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ) at the 9:30 AM Mass to witness the 2nd grade in their First Holy Communion outfits crown the Blessed Mother.

If you want to be inspired Google: Christiane Amanpour and Jory Fleming's 16-minute interview. Jory Fleming graduated Summa Cum Laude from South Carolina University and received a Rhodes Scholarship to Oxford University in London. He is on the spectrum of Autism and wrote a book on Being in Human in an autistic world. The interviewer Walter Isaacson asks profound questions and Jory responded with amazing insight into how he thinks. It is a brilliant interview.

Come Holy Spirit and enkindle in us the fire of your love.

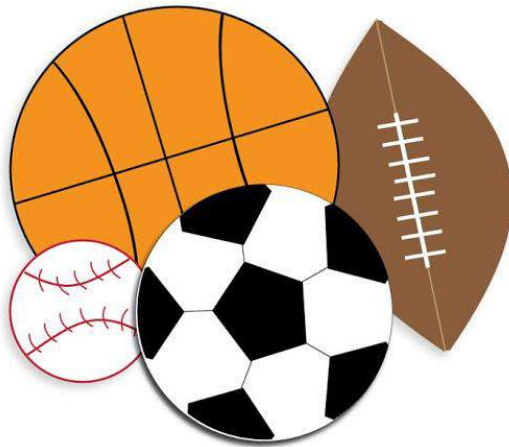
OLSS SUMMER BASKETBALL LEAGUE

Second Reading

Brothers and sisters: No one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.
