A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Happy 4th of July Weekend! As we honor our 245th year as a nation, we pray for God to bring peace, justice and unity to our land. I want to honor all in our military who protect our freedom home and abroad and for all veterans who have served our country. I also pray for all our elected officials that we may preserve the dignity of our democracy and respect for all human life.

On Monday October 18, 2021 at 7PM the University of Notre Dame Glee Club will have a 20th Anniversary of 9/11 Concert at our church. More information will be forthcoming. The cost of admission is \$35 and the proceeds will go to benefit Bread of Life Food Drive and Our Lady Star of the Sea School. Following the concert light refreshments will be served.

The pastor of Holy Family Church and chaplain to the Knights of Columbus, Father Angelo "AJ" Micciula needs your prayers. He has been diagnosed with stage 4 Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) with a GFR# of 21 (15 or less is stage five renal failure). We are spreading that word that he needs a kidney transplant. Doctors say that the kidney transplant from a live donor is the best treatment option not only to extend his life expectancy, but also to improve his return to quality of lifestyle. Father Micciula has been ordained for 16 years...please keep him in your prayers.

Below are The Venerable Fulton J. Sheen's comments on sin and death.

When does the soul die? Where there is the domination of the lower order over the higher order, whenever there is the domination of the individual over the community, of flesh over the spirit, of time over eternity, of the body over the soul, then there is death and that death we call sin. That is why scripture equates death in the biological order and sin in the moral order: "The wages of sin is death".

If you buy an electric coffee pot, you will find instructions. The instructions may read, "Do not plug the coffee pot in when the pot is empty." Well suppose you say, "Why should anybody tell me what to do? He's violating my constitutional rights." When you say that, you forget that the manufacturer of that coffee pot gave you instructions in order that get the perfect coffee out of it. Sin is the violation of the law of God. When God made us He gave us certain laws., not in order to destroy our freedom, but in order that we might perfect ourselves. When we violate those laws, we break a relationship and hurt ourselves. That is why in the parable of the Prodigal Son, the father said of the prodigal, "He was dead. Now he is alive".

Cardinal Timothy Dolan comments on Ephesians 4: 25 "Therefore putting away falsehood, speak the truth, each one to his neighbor for we are members of one another".

I hear remarks like this a lot today, "I used to be a Catholic, and I grew up Catholic". Sometimes the people making those remarks have fallen away temporarily and into to return to Church. However, most of the time, they do not have warm and grateful sentiments about the Church.

Unfortunately, when I hear personalities on TV or the radio say, "I used to be Catholic," they imply, "I'm beyond that now. I'm enlightened and liberated from those silly, superstitious shackles, and now I am a free thinker, a mature adult."

In his Letter to the Ephesians, Saint Paul urged us not be like children "tossed by waves and swept along by every wind of teaching arising from human trickery."

Pope Benedict XVI once observed that "what takes real courage is adhering to the faith... even when it contradicts the 'scheme' of the contemporary world."

Our faith in Christ and His Church is not childish baggage that is discarded when we become grown-ups. There's nothing more adult, enlightened, or freeing than our Catholic faith, no matter what the in crowd preens about.

In reality, the truly enlightened, mature, liberated folks are those who are humbly, joyfully, and gratefully confident in their Catholic faith and are well aware of the Church's struggles but who live their faith sincerely and pass it on to their kids. Now that's adult faith "

May you have a blessed week and stay safe from the heat. We miss seeing you...please come back to church on the weekend. It is a delight in seeing you rejoin with us.
